Community Council Summary*:

- -the Board approved an expenditure of \$60 for an event banner
- -the Board approved the nominating committee which oversees the nominations of the officers set for the June meeting
- -the Board reviewed the latest update on the SDG&E gas pipeline
- -the Board reviewed the election process. Three members will be stepping down. No contested races this year, but four new members will be joining the Board. The bylaws state that if there are no contested races, then the Declaration of Candidacy form acts as the one vote needed to be elected. There is one vacancy in District D and one vacancy in District F.
- -the RB Alive Ad-hoc will be meeting May 22 to finalize plans for the information booth.
- -the annual Earth Day event was a huge success with over 30 vendors and 22 volunteers to assist with the success of the event.
- -the Public Safety committee is in full speed in preparing for the annual Safety Fair and first responder appreciation BBQ set for September 29th

-the Maintenance Assessment District (MAD) committee reviewed the proposed design for the turf to drought tolerant plants on RB Road median between Bernardo Center Drive and Acena.

Community Planners Committee*:

Community Planner Committee Notes Meeting of April 24, 2018 Submitted by Vicki Touchstone

Council member David Alvarez discussed his ideas to revise and reform the City's sidewalk repair policy (Council Policy 200-12). He was very concerned about the poor quality of sidewalks in many parts of the City. It impacts the ability for older citizens, parents with strollers, those with disabilities, and others to use the sidewalks and also represents a safety issue for all users. The City has paid out significant amounts of money to settle law suits related to unsafe sidewalks. In some cases, property owners are responsible for the sidewalk repairs, while in other cases the City is responsible. More money needs to be allocated to sidewalk repairs.

The new Planning Director, Mike Hansen, was introduced to the group.

We received a presentation on the Master Stormwater System Maintenance Program. More information is available on the City's stormwater webpage.

Maya Rosas from Circulate San Diego presented the proposals for restructuring CPGs. These are the recommendations in the "Democracy in Planning" document. Many of the CPC members expressed their opinions about the recommendations – there was agreement expressed for some of the recommendations, but strong opposition for others including the proposal that the City Council be able to appoint members to a CPG.

New offices will be elected to the CPC next month.
