**D. PUBLIC COMMUNICATION** - Speakers are limited to topics not listed on the agenda. Presentations are limited to 2 minutes or less.

Sonya Solinsky stated that the subcommittee's next steps are focusing on the Mid-Coast Feeder Study and the ballot. Sonya continued that they have written to the SANDAG Midcoast Study Group asking that our communities be included in reroutes. Sonya stated that the Mid-Coast Feeder Study is focused on collecting input for rerouting bus lines to connect to the future Mid-Coast trolley station at the University of California, San Diego. Next, Sonya stated that the MTS 2020 Ballot Measure, if approved, will increase funds to be used for transit through a new sales tax (.5%). Sonya stated that the transit subcommittee would like the Board to write a letter to

MTS requesting a speaker attend a future planning board meeting to talk about the 2020 Ballot Measure and also ask that MTS allocate funds for transit in our communities. Chair White stated that he will write a letter. Chair White clarified that he is hesitant to vote for an increased sales tax that brings no benefit to North City. Sonya stated that additional steps also include gathering city council representative support. Sonya encouraged residents to take the SANDAG survey as this creates the data that is presented to SANDAG and MTS to communicate transit need in North City.

Karen Cody stated that it is important to keep the signage code consistent with the code instated in 1985. Karen continued that allowing a shopping center to change the code will create a domino effect resulting in other shopping centers not adhering to the current code.

Resident Karen Schlueter brought attention to a bent Carmel Valley sign on Del Mar Heights Road; she requested the sign be replaced. Steve Hadley asked if FBA money could be used to replace the sign with a monument sign. Ken Farinsky stated it is also possible to use MAD money. Chair White stated that they will look into the issue. Karen continued that the bridge connecting to Del Mar Highlands looks dated. Chair White stated that both issues can be looked into at a future date.

H. COUNCIL DISTRICT 1 REPORT - Steve Hadley, Office of Councilmember Barbara Bry

Steve Hadley invited the community to the town hall budget forum in May at the Carmel Valley Center. Steve stated the proposed budget will be released April 15, 2019.

Steve stated that Carmel Valley Park will open on April 10, 2019.

Steve stated that concerns regarding the new stop signs in the Watermark and surrounding communities will be collected and reviewed in May.

Barry Schultz stated that he read in a newspaper that the City and San Diego State are having confidential conversations regarding the stadium which stands in contrast to the transparency process promised through the San Diego West Initiative. Steve Hadley stated that he will bring concerns and questions to Councilmember Barbara Bry.

A resident asked for an update on the off-leash dog problem. Steve stated he has asked Humane Society to provide reinforcement of the off-leash law at parks. Debbie Lokanc added that four new signs, reminding residents of the law, were placed in Del Mar Park resulting in decreased issues. Steve Hadley stated that it is helpful if residents call Humane Society to inform the organization of issues.

Resident Karen Schlueter asked about minimal landscaping on on-ramps in Carmel Valley which are being paid for by One Paseo. Steve stated that a committee ensures One Paseo's project development is kept in coordination with the final plan submitted to the City. Steve stated he will ask the committee to look into landscaping on the on-ramps.

Karen Cody inquired about the bus from One Paseo. Ken Farinsky stated that the shuttle moves between One Paseo and the Solana Beach Transit Center. Ken stated that there are no stops in between. Ken stated that there is only one bus, but he does not know the frequency or hours of operation. Karen responded that she will look into the issue and report what she finds at the next meeting.
