Comments on the San Diego State University (SDSU) Mission Valley Campus Draft Environmental Impact Report (EIR).

Subcommittee MOTION: To send the following comments on the SDSU Mission Valley Campus Draft EIR:

1. The City should grant authorization to implement improvements as outlined in the Draft EIR for the California State University (CSU)

2. The outdated methodology of Level of Service (LOS) should not be the only methodology used to determine transportation impacts and mitigation, and other methods should be used such as Vehicle Miles Traveled (VMT) that are consistent with the City General Plan and the Climate Action Plan.

3. The SDSU Mission Valley Campus Draft EIR shall match the Mission Valley Community Plan Update that was approved by City Council on 9/10/19 for traffic mitigation and fire safety

4. The following additional recommendations are made for Texas Street/Qualcomm Way:

a. Adding protected bike lanes on Texas Street/Qualcomm Way from Camino Del Rio

South to Friars Road would improve bicycle utilization b. Adding a northbound right turn lane at Texas St. and Camino Del Rio South would improve traffic flow 5. The following intersections should have synchronized traffic lights to improve traffic flow:

a. Texas St. at Camino del Rio South and at I-8 Eastbound Off Ramp

b. Qualcomm Way at Camino del Rio North and at Camino de la Reina

Subcommitte Motion: To revise the website description for PF&T as follows:

Public Facilities identifies public facility needs and makes recommendations regarding parks and open spaces, libraries, law enforcement and fire stations, sewer and water lines, storm drains, power lines, joint use agreements, public artworks, Capital Improvement Program, etc. Subcommittee also provides a forum for discussion about proposed changes to Balboa Park adjacent to North Park.

Transportation advises the Planning and Traffic Departments of the City of San Diego and the Third District City Council member on North Park traffic, parking, streets, bike lanes, signage and public transportation issues. The subcommittee has identifies and prioritizes various traffic problems that need calming measures, including pedestrian crosswalks, and requests for stop signs at various locations. The subcommittee will help implement the Mobility Element of the North Park Community Plan.
