SDSU West

Gina Jacobs, Chief of Staff to President Roush. Dan Montoya, Assistant VP for SDSU Alumni.

Gave PowerPoint presentation. See website for details!

Talked to local higher education about partnering. Does not believe there is an earthquake fault at the site. D. Fitzgerald. asks where funding is coming from. Private partnerships and leases so no public funding. Buildings would be owned by private/public partners initially (leases) then some would go over to SDSU ownership. Full build out estimated at 15 yrs. L. Grucela asks how much housing (student/public). Stadium to be owned by university. Justine asks if need to pay development impact fees. Gina not sure but will go thru CEQA process. Dan Smith concerned about traffic. Low amount of traffic expected due to trolley stop at site and students oriented. M. Reed asks how underground parking can be added. It is on west side of side and flooding not affected. D. Livingston asks why SDSU not partner with Soccer city. Gina says they did not have same vision and goals. J. Wilson asks about property tax. All 4,600 units subject to taxes. SD River Park Foundation on board, but they have not taken a position yet. Audience member says this initiative provides chance for pro football, gives SDSU a stadium at half soccer city density. Concerned about initiative process is they generally step away from community planning process. Would like to see SDSU take to Mission Valley Planning Group and give assurances so we can see same as private developer would have to show.

much in property taxes would be paid? Private developers would pay tax. Audience member asks about 65 members of SDSU west. Is there any profit gained for this group. No!
