B. Michelle White: Shared concerns about oversized rental properties at 6480 & 6482 Montezuma Rd. With additions and ADU there will be 18 bedrooms on a single lot. 20 or more residents on one lot pose dangers (fires, traffic) seriously strain infrastructure & police. Another 2 story ADU is proposed for 6460 Montezuma, already a 6 bedroom house. I'd like to prevent that from being built in addition to the above.

- A. Discussion of relationship & coordination of CACPB, CACC, CA Community Coalition: Reynoso. you all received by-laws, including Coalition's as background
  - 1. Lengthy discussion revolved around the following issues:
    - a. Separating CACPB & CACC into 2 separate organizations meeting on different days.
      - Meetings would be shorter & more focused. They have very different mandates.
      - Some felt this would encourage greater community attendance, others are not convinced. Community survey to reveal community preferences is needed.
      - Separate boards would make it harder to get board members; it is hard enough with 1board.
      - Some discussion about meeting times for 2 separate boards.
    - b. Merging Community Council (Current CACC) & Community Coalition (501(c)3 entity established to hold funds to support CACC activities & projects.)
      - This should not proceed without legal advice for a complex merger;
      - If this is done CACC would become a 501(c)3 organization. Some questioned if such an organizations & boards have this status, others asked if CACC would be prohibited from urging city action on community issues. Many community organizations are non-profit. They cannot raise funds for lobbying or lobby the city, but are not prohibited from discussing their concerns with the city.
    - c. A committee has been formed to explore legal & by-laws concerns for both these issues. The committee, including tonight's volunteers, is: Montana (convener), Jenkins, Nystrom, Schneider, Silva, Yakutis.

A. Susan Baldwin: Presentation by Parks & Recreation Coalition (PARC), responding to the draft Parks Master Plan & Recreation element continued by the city council. PARC requests support to mayor & city council for improvements to PMP & direction for staff to work with CPGs, RAGs and PARC for input.

- 1. PARC asks CAPB support for recommended improvements, with a letter to Mayor & City Council, & requesting city work with community and recreation groups.
- 2. Main Points of concern with Park Master Plan (which city council did not approve in November) a. Document lacks community input, expert advice ignored.
  - b. Plan eliminates the goals of walking distance parks, & standards of park acreage/population; greater population needs more park space.
  - c. Plan evaluates Parks using points which focus on amenities, not passive recreation, It pits park amenities against park land.
  - d. Needs to use funds to increase park land, with increased density. It does not adequately address park inequities.
  - e. It commercializes public parks & ignores historic resources.
