801 - Muska Laiq, LEED AP, Naval Base Point Loma:

- The Navy owns and operates a 17 mile fuel pipeline between Naval Base Point Loma and Miramar MCAS
- The pipeline is inspected every 5 years
- The pipeline has been in operation for 70 years
- The Navy's plan is to reroute the pipeline whose underground sections are near High Tech High School and Huntington drive. A map of the proposed routes was presented.
- Construction is expected to take place in 2024. Area residences and businesses will be notified via social media and letters sent via USPS.

Once construction is complete, what will happen to the existing pipes that will no longer be in use? The answer was that they would be cleaned, capped off and filled with concrete.
