1. City of San Diego Redistricting Commission

City of San Diego Redistricting Commission will present on their upcoming efforts to establish new voting districts in the city of San Diego in accordance with State Law. The Commission hopes to share awareness of this effort and seeks public input on their plans.

Public Comment:

<u>Pat Sexton</u>: The growth in City Council District 3 shows that we need to slow down new construction in North Park.

<u>Presenter Response</u>: A lot of the new growth happening in District 3 is happening downtown.

Steve Oechel: Is it possible to add a tenth council district?

<u>Presenter Response:</u> No, the commission is tasked with redrawing the lines of the existing nine districts.

Board Comment:

Arash K: Are there plans for future updates?

<u>Presenter Response:</u> Speaker is happy to return to future meetings. Also see website and social media for the latest details.

Basil M: Can we add a distinct?

<u>Presenter Response:</u> It is possible for the city council to change the city charter, but that is outside the purview of the commission.

Beau B: Is the goal to have the smallest deviation?

Presenter Response: all nine districts should be about the same size.

Jeff O: Will the commission use physical boundaries like highways and canyons.

Presenter Response: Yes.

Jessica R: Interested in mapping tools and concerned about access to meetings.

<u>Presenter Response:</u> software selection will prioritize public access to online mapping tools, and future meetings will be scheduled to accommodate weekends and evenings. Also-videos, minutes, and agendas are available to the public.

Josh B: Are historical maps available?

<u>Presenter Response:</u> the city has access to the 2010 commission website, but the addition of the ninth council district may make comparisons to the past mute.

Matt S.: Will the commission factor in the boundaries of CPGs and what are the priorities?

<u>Presenter Response:</u> Nothing will be prioritized. All factors must be considered. Currently planning groups do fit within council districts, if that is important CPGs should express that to the commission.

Tyler R: Will the commission factor in projections for growth?

<u>Presenter Response:</u> the commission will use census data from 2020. Perhaps projected growth should be factored in.

Aria P: Is ethnicity factored in?

<u>Presenter Response:</u> Communities of Interest have been considered in the past and will be a part of the process this time as well.

2. Presentation by PATH on the Mid-City outreach program

PATH (People Assisting The Homeless) will give an update and presentation on their work with the Mid-City outreach Program. This program works to create touch points with unsheltered people in the Mid-City neighborhoods in San Diego with the goal of connecting them with resources and services.

Pat Sexton: How many people did you talk to, how many stayed in housing?

<u>Presenter Response:</u> 181 contacts, 105 offered housing, 21 stayed in permanent housing.

Steve Oechel: Thank you. Do you have numbers on progress?

Presenter Response: PATH has placed 21 people in permanent housing.

Randy Walsh: Does access to tech help your progress?

Presenter Response: it is essential.

John Hartley: How many workers have been deployed?

Presenter Response: first one, then two, soon a third will be added.

<u>Tyler R:</u> I work at PATH. It is a community collaboration that started in North Park. Homelessness, transportation, and housing are all connected.

Matt S: Is PATH an alternative to policing? How can we help?

Marissa T-B: How can individuals help?

Josh B: Good luck with funding from Sacramento.

Beau B.: Let's work on prevention in addition to street level services.

Basil M: Expressed concerns about alternatives to policing.

Daniel M.: Curious about long term solutions and follow up for PATH clients.

<u>Jessica R:</u> Concerned about the impact of COVID19 and the end of the eviction moratorium.
