INFORMATIONAL ITEMS

- Presentation by Craig Rose from Public Power San Diego
 - City's 50-year franchise agreement with SDGE expires in January 2021
 - The mayor is auctioning off a 20-year franchise agreement
 - Public Power considers it a rigged auction and urges the City Council to vote No
 - Mayor's proposal has a minimum bid of less than 1 percent of the franchise value
 - The city hired a consultant who undervalued the franchise
 - Public Power wants an additional year to determine the franchise's real value

SUB-COMMITTEE REPORTS

- Parks Daniele
 - Little League report
 - Water has been staying on, grass has been mowed
 - Have not heard back from the city regarding the SUP
 - City engineer completed methane readings in all sheds

- CPC update Linda
 - Numerous complaints about deficiencies in city's noticing process
 - Voted to request larger, more clear signs and other information from DSD
 - Issues with street vendors in open space in Ocean Beach: no social distancing, no masks, unpermitted, no sales tax to the city, often leave trash behind
 - Ocean Beach requested that CPC support them in sending a letter to the city requesting regulations for street vendors
 - CPC voted to support and request an executive order from the mayor to immediately regulate the street vendors
- Transportation & Bike Path Mario
 - Checked out bike lanes and traffic circles on Meade
 - Still working on final design for University Bikeway
