Please an orientation to "Kates' trees" on alternating Thursdays at 5 pm until Thanksgiving, and Fridays at noon ("learn at lunch!").

ONE: Explore how climate, heat, health, shade, trees and equity are connected. Learn about benefits of trees and urban greening in San Diego. Build climate action through public awareness, advocacy and passion.

TWO: Get basics of how to grow healthy trees, identify planting sites, get a tree, and take care of the trees we have.

The newly-organized Kate Sessions' Commitment focuses on planting 100 trees in various communities each year in the 2020s. It is an echo back to Kate Sessions' agreement with city leaders to plant 100 trees per year in Balboa Park in the early 1900s. We are committed to participating in neighborhood investments, as climate change is accelerating, cities are warming, health impacts and community inequities are more evident, and public desire for action is increasing. Remember the saying that "the best time to plant a tree was 20 years ago, and the second-best time is today."

The Kate Sessions "team" has launched a website, www.katesessionstrees.org, and we offer presentations and consultations. We can give a short (5-minute?) presentation to your community planning group (videoconference) meeting: How can I get a tree? Where can I plant a tree? How do I grow a healthy tree? How do I protect and maintain the trees we already have? Members of the City's Community Forest Advisory Board (CFAB) can also participate in such a presentation-agenda item.

There are several ways to get trees. The City of San Diego has increased its tree planting budget from \$100,000 in FY20 to \$400,000 in FY21, to plant street trees in 15-gallon containers on right-of-way property (not just parkways). These are known as "free" trees, and the request begins with a "watering agreement" from residents and businesses (twice weekly in the first year, weekly in next several years, then monthly as the tree grows). We're exploring some alternate watering approaches for blocks of trees planted in street easements and front yards. More info and request form at <https://www.sandiego.gov/blog/free-tree-sd>.

The Kate Sessions Commitment has reserved yard trees planted in smaller 5-gallon containers, that are available for purchase (now) at \$20 to \$40 and pick-up (this "winter") from two retail nurseries. Five hundred ornamental, 200 native, and 200 fruit trees have been reserved, and will be inspected by a certified arborist before they are shipped from the wholesale nurseries.

Please Note: Due to the COVID-19 public health emergency, Serra Mesa Community Planning Group is unable to host physical meetings. Instead, pursuant to the Governor's executive order N-25-20, as interpreted by City authorities, the SMPG meetings will be held via video conference until further notice.

In planning this meeting, we consulted information given by Michael Prinz from the City of San Diego, who provided us with the following clarifications:

- Due to the relaxation of the Brown Act rules, board members are allowed to vote via videoconference.
- The board members whose terms were up in March can be considered extended until we are able to hold the election, allowing them the ability to vote as well. This protocol has also been decided upon and executed by additional community planning groups.
