


# San Diego Promise Zone | Strategic Plan

The Promise: To co-create an ecosystem of opportunity and investment through collaboration that addresses systemic racism and inequities to improve the quality of life of Promise Zone residents.

How do we do it? By fostering partnerships with community-serving organizations, government agencies, philanthropic, corporate, and educational institutions with shared goals.

### **Outcomes** (metrics)

- Low- to moderate-income households will be able to achieve the goal of home ownership (Rates of home ownership)




Affordable housing will be developed, constructed, retained and rehabilitated (SDPZ housing inventory)



- Residents will have access to affordable residential options with proximity to transit, healthy food, and green space
- Residents will improve economic mobility (Labor force participation and unemployment rates)



- Residents will experience improved health and less chronic disease
- Residents will have access to quality healthcare in the Promise Zone (Health insurance coverage)



- Students will be school-ready, will perform at or above grade level expectations, and will be college or career ready at graduation (California school dashboard)
- New businesses will open, providing jobs for residents and economic growth for the area (SDPZ Business Activity Dashboard)
- Businesses will be strengthened, grow in number and thrive (Active businesses)
- Public spaces will be more appealing and have more amenities
- Residents will purchase goods and services in their neighborhood more often
- Opportunity Youth will have access to educational and credentialing opportunities, internships and well-paying jobs

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The San Diego Promise Zone is a collaborative network driven by 6 goals, championed by 6 working groups and more than 80 partners, to improve the quality of life of 80,000 residents across 4 City Council Districts, 15 Neighborhoods, and 19 Census Tracts.



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### **About the Promise Zone**

In 2016, the San Diego Promise Zone became one of 22 federally designated Promise Zones in the United States and one of only four in California. The San Diego Promise Zone covers a 6.4-square-mile targeted area that spans East Village and Barrio Logan east to Encanto and is home to the City's most culturally rich and ethnically diverse neighborhoods, but also some of the most underserved communities. More than 80,000 San Diegans live in the Promise Zone, an area where unemployment is high (15.61 percent, pre-pandemic), and poverty is concentrated (39.06 percent).

Through the Promise Zone initiative, community-based organizations, direct service providers, residents, and business owners work with government agencies to streamline resources and deliver comprehensive support.

- 10-Year Strategic Planning Process
- All 19 Census tracts designated as qualified Opportunity Zones
- NASSCO partnership to create pipeline of Opportunity Youth to employment
- Expedited permitting for affordable housing projects in Promise Zone
- Higher reimbursements and waitlist lifted for small businesses in Promise Zone through Storefront Improvement Program
- 5-year financial partnership with California Coast Credit Union to administer one-time capacity building, community outreach, and workforce development micro-grants to partners
