- a. Old Otay Mesa Road Improvements Status: (Information Only) Improvements to the Old Otay Mesa Road approximately between Remington Hills Drive and Crescent Bay Drive (near San Ysidro High School) in the Otay Mesa Community Plan Area. The improvements will include 2 traffic lanes, sidewalks on both sides of the street, bike lanes and lighting. The project is fully funded and scheduled to begin in the fall of 2014.
- b. San Ysidro Community Plan Update Status: (Information Only) Sara Osborn and Nancy Bragado of the City of San Diego presented. A comprehensive San Ysidro Community Plan Update started in July 2010. It aims to reflect current conditions, improve mobility, including the pedestrian environment and address quality of life issues. Status of the SYCP update and summary of the input received by the Planning Commission on December 5, 2013. A Draft Plan should be available for review in May then the CEQA process begins.
- **C.** Public Utilities Consumer Outreach: (Information Only). Dave Akin, Consumer Advocate for City of San Diego presented. Understanding the customer's water/sewer bill, an overview of fixed and variable fees and charges. Go Green, there is an online self-service option, an overview of key infrastructure and services and what the customer can do when a utility bill is higher than expected. - **d.** San Ysidro Intermodal Transit Center: (Information Only) Miguel Aguirre, Property Owner presented. Alternative to the MTS/SANDAG "Option 3" at the International Border. He proposes better accommodation for the shared uses by pedestrians, private vehicles, mass transit, to provide for workforce/economic development opportunities, and potentially reduce the environmental, safety and public health impacts.
- e. <u>US EPA Environmental Justice Collaborative Problem-Solving Grant.</u> David Flores, Casa Familiar, Inc. presenting. Requesting a support letter for installation of monitoring devices at San Ysidro school sites to document air pollution along the border and to provide for education and outreach. A Motion was made by S. Otto and seconded by A. Martinez to provide a letter from the SY Community Planning Group in support of this Grant application.
- f. Establishing the Election Subcommittee for 2014. Per SYCPG Bylaws, in February the Chairman shall establish a committee of at least 3 (but no more than 5) persons not standing for election. Elections will be held for seven (7) of the fifteen (15) seats on the <u>San Ysidro Community</u> <u>Planning Group</u>. The elections are on **Monday, March 17, 2014**. The polls open at 5:30 p.m. and close at 7:00 p.m. The term is four (4) years, ending in April, 2018. The polling place is at: San Ysidro School District Governing Board Room, 4350 Otay Mesa Road (north of Beyer Blvd) in San Ysidro.

The SYCPG was formally recognized in 1967 by the City Council of the City of San Diego to make recommendations to the City Planning Commission, City Council, City staff, and other governmental agencies on land use matters, specifically concerning the preparation of, adoption of, implementation of, or amendment to, the General Plan and/or the San Ysidro Community Plan. The SYCPG also advises on other land use matters as requested by the City of San Diego, other governmental agencies, or other interested persons. The San Ysidro Community Plan was adopted in 1974 and 1990. A plan update is now underway with a scheduled completion in 2015.

The community plan boundaries are generally described as: starting at the intersection of I-905 and I-5; southeast along I-5 to Dairy Mart Road; south to Camino De La Plaza, Tijuana River Levee, and International border; east to the top of the Otay Mesa hillsides; northwest to the intersection of I-805 and I-905; west along I-905 to its intersection with I-5.

Our regular meetings are held on the third Monday of each month; called to order at 5:30 p.m.

TO <u>VOTE</u> IN THE ELECTION: must be a General Member who is: (1) at least 18 years of age; <u>AND</u> (2) a property owner, or designee of the property owner; <u>OR</u> (3) a resident; <u>OR</u> (4) a local businessperson or not-for-profit with a business address in the community and employees or operators of the business or not-for-profit at that address. **Eligibility must be verified by the Election Subcommittee.**

TO BE A <u>CANDIDATE</u> FOR ELECTION a person who is not already a General Member must have been documented as attending at least one of the last 12 regular meetings and also have a membership application on file by the February 24, 2014 regular meeting.

At the SYCPG regular meeting on February 24, 2014 qualified candidates will be announced. Other nominations will be considered at that time, and only if qualification can be determined. Thereafter, nominations will be closed and the ballot finalized for the March 17, 2014 election.

EXHIBIT "B"APPLICATION FOR GENERAL MEMBERSHIP – PAGE 2 OF 2

The following is a summary of Article III, Section 2 of the bylaws.

To be an eligible community member an individual must be

- at least 18 years of age, and
- shall be affiliated with the community as a:
 - o property owner, who is an individual identified as the sole or partial owner of record, or their designee, of a real property (either developed or undeveloped), within the community planning area, or
 - o resident, who is an individual whose primary address of residence is an address in the community planning area, or
 - o local business person, who is a local business or not-for-profit owner, operator, or designee at a non-residential real property address in the community planning area.

Only eligible community members have the right to vote at the SYCPG general election and to be a candidate for election.

An individual may become an eligible member of the community by demonstrating qualifications to the planning group Secretary or Election Committee prior to the March election or at the time of voting. Eligibility is demonstrating by filing this *Application for General Membership* and upon validation of the affiliation requirements.

For the purpose of qualifying a "designee" of a not-for-profit, in addition to this membership form, the designee must be identified by name in writing by the qualifying governing body or its senior executive.

For the purposes of qualification as a General Member, a "not-for-profit" is defined as an existing community organization, association, or institution which has its headquarters or a site office at a physical location at a non-residential real property address within the San Ysidro Community Plan area, and serves the constituents of the planning area.

Among the duties of the elected SYCPG members is the requirement to attend meetings. There are no "excused absences." The SYCPG shall find that a vacancy exists upon receipt of a resignation in writing from one of its members or upon receipt of a written report from the planning group's secretary reporting the third consecutive absence or fourth absence in the 12-month period of April through March each year, of a member(s) from the planning group's regular meetings.
