#### **VACANCIES**

[Excerpts from the SYCPG Bylaws of June 17, 2015]

The SYCPG should fill vacancies at the time the vacancies are declared by selection by the elected planning group members at the time the vacancies are declared, but not sooner than the next regular meeting at which a quorum is present. Vacancies shall be filled by a majority vote to elect a candidate to the vacant seat, or if more than one vacancy, then the seats are filled by plurality. Publication in a regular meeting agenda shall be sufficient notice of the vacancy.

No person shall be considered for a vacant or open seat who has previously been an elected or appointed member in the twelve (12) months immediately preceding the day the vacancy or opening was declared.

Two or more concurrent SYCPG vacancies shall be filled by a vote of all eligible members of the community by secret written ballot.


[An individual must be recorded on the SYCPG Master Membership List as determined by the Secretary, and] must be at least 18 years of age, and shall be affiliated with the community as a:

- (1) property owner, who is an individual identified as the sole or partial owner of record, or their designee, of a real property (either developed or undeveloped), within the community planning area, or
- (2) resident, [including a renter or tenant] who is an individual whose primary address of residence is an address in the community planning area, or
- (3) local business person, who is a local business or not-for-profit owner, operator, or designee at a non-residential real property address in the community planning area; only one representative of a particular establishment may hold a seat on the community planning group at one time.

For the purpose of qualifying a "designee" of a not-for-profit . . . the designee must be identified by name in writing by the qualifying governing body or its chief executive.

When the SYCPG is unable to fill a vacancy within 120 days . . . and the planning group has more than twelve members, a search for a new member should continue, however either the seat may remain vacant until the next planning group election, or these bylaws may be amended to permit decreased membership to a minimum of 12 members.

# **EXHIBIT "B"**APPLICATION FOR GENERAL MEMBERSHIP – PAGE 2 OF 2

The following is a summary of Article III, Section 2 of the bylaws.

To be an eligible community member an individual must be

- at least 18 years of age, and
- shall be affiliated with the community as a:
  - o property owner, who is an individual identified as the sole or partial owner of record, or their designee, of a real property (either developed or undeveloped), within the community planning area, or
  - o resident, who is an individual whose primary address of residence is an address in the community planning area, or
  - local business person, who is a local business or not-for-profit owner, operator, or designee at a non-residential real property address in the community planning area.

Only eligible community members have the right to vote at the SYCPG general election and to be a candidate for election.

An individual may become an eligible member of the community by demonstrating qualifications to the planning group Secretary or Election Committee prior to the March election or at the time of voting. Eligibility is demonstrating by filing this *Application for General Membership* and upon validation of the affiliation requirements.

For the purpose of qualifying a "designee" of a not-for-profit, in addition to this membership form, the designee must be identified by name in writing by the qualifying governing body or its senior executive.

For the purposes of qualification as a General Member, a "not-for-profit" is defined as an existing community organization, association, or institution which has its headquarters or a site office at a physical location at a non-residential real property address within the San Ysidro Community Plan area, and serves the constituents of the planning area.

Among the duties of the elected SYCPG members is the requirement to attend meetings. There are no "excused absences." The SYCPG shall find that a vacancy exists upon receipt of a resignation in writing from one of its members or upon receipt of a written report from the planning group's secretary reporting the third consecutive absence or fourth absence in the 12-month period of April through March each year, of a member(s) from the planning group's regular meetings. An individual who vacates a seat after eight consecutive years may not again be elected or appointed for a period of one year.








# San Ysidro Port of Entry District Wayfinding Directional Signs: Feasibility Study

### **March 2015**





#### **Project Description**

The Port of Entry District has undergone significant changes with the Land Port of Entry (LPOE) reconfiguration and supports 8 million annual pedestrians crossing the border, with projected growth to 12 million by 2030. Because of the changes in pedestrian access at the LPOE and the significant community interest in directional signs at the border, it is recommended to implement a wayfinding program within the Port of Entry District in the immediate future to serve one of the region's busiest pedestrian districts. In addition, pursuing a wayfinding program at this location will compliment the new LPOE. The demand on pedestrian infrastructure is significant and implementing a unified sign program in the District will help visitors, commuters, and residents orient themselves and help them find local services, transit and other facilities safely and more efficiently. The study proposes to locate twelve (12) directional signs at various locations with the Port of Entry District.

#### Right-of-way Acquisition & Environmental Clearance

No right of way acquisition will be required. Signs will be located within the right of way through an Encroachment Maintenance & Removal Agreement (EMRA) or similar permitting process as determined by the City of San Diego Development Services Department. Likewise, the environmental clearance will be determined through the permitting phase of the project. **Figure: San Ysidro Wayfinding Signage – Proposed Locations** provides preliminary locations of twelve (12) directional signs within the Port of Entry District. The locations selected were determined based on:

- City staff site visits to the area;
- The location of existing and future transit facilities;
- The location of existing and future pedestrian crossings;
- Documented patterns for pedestrian travel;

The final location of directional signs will require vetting with the community through the permitting phase of development.

#### **Final Design**

Refer to **Figure: Wayfinding Signs Design** for examples of the look and feel of the directional signs. A combination of interpretive signs, directory signs, directional sign, and community directional signs will be used. In addition, the draft San Ysidro Community Plan Urban Design Element Section 4.11 Wayfinding includes further examples and policy direction for a communitywide wayfinding program. The communitywide wayfinding includes neighborhood branding and signs for all mode users. The community was engaged in the initial design of the signs through this effort. Once funding is available for construction of the signs, further public outreach regarding the placement and final design will be shared with the community during the permitting phase of the project.


#### **Outreach & Local Commitment**

The Port of Entry District in San Ysidro is undergoing a huge transformation with the reconfiguration of the LPOE at the international border. Through the public outreach for the San Ysidro Community Plan Update residents, businesses, visitors and commuters have expressed the need for better pedestrian infrastructure, including a cohesive sign program, to improve the border area's mobility and make it more attractive, safer, and easier to navigate. The community supports the efforts within the plan



update to develop a wayfinding program. The Urban Design Element of the draft community plan provides policy direction and outlines a comprehensive wayfinding program which includes iconic gateway signs, neighborhood markers, freeway directional signs, and pedestrians/bicyclist directional signs.


The community plan update has been a five year public process and outreach consists of residents, students, business owners, employees, local non-profits, and regional, state and federal governmental agencies. In addition, the demand on pedestrian infrastructure is significant in the (LPOE) District which is documented by multiple planning studies, including the Mobility Study for the San Ysidro community plan update, the recently completed Border Health Equity Transportation Study, the 2010 San Ysidro Port of Entry Reconfiguration Mobility Study and the 2009 San Ysidro Mobility Strategy. All of these studies included significant public participation and outreach.









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


## San Ysidro Wayfinding Signage - Proposed Locations





