## San Diego Fire-Rescue Department Cadet Summer Academy Media Day Scheduled for July 18

YOUTH AGES 16-21 PARTICIPATING IN FIREFIGHTING ACTIVITIES IN A WEEK-LONG ACADEMY PRESENTED BY THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO

SAN DIEGO – Media are invited as the San Diego Fire-Rescue Department (SDFD) presents its 27<sup>th</sup> annual cadet summer academy for current fire cadets ages 16 to 21. The goal of the SDFD Cadet Program is to give young men and women an inside look into fire and emergency medical services careers. There are currently about 200 cadets in the program who represent San Diego's diverse demographics including 20 percent who are young women. The cadet academy is presented once a year and is patterned after the SDFD basic fire academy. Cadets train in a variety of firefighting skills including search and rescue, hose lays, rappelling, physical fitness, first aid and ladder evolutions.

"The young men and women involved in our Cadet Program learn valuable leadership skills which help them stay focused on their futures and stay in school," said Interim Chief Kevin Ester. "This program allows them to engage in challenging activities with firefighters and consider a career in fire or emergency medical service."
