Efforts were undertaken to form and foster collaborations with agencies that were able to support clients through a share of resources, such as a microenterprise mentoring program through the University of San Diego Business MBA program. Despite continued outreach efforts and program enhancement of resources through collaboration with other agencies, Access was unable to meet the goal of providing assistance to 86 businesses. Access experienced a sharp decline in attendance for all programs targeting immigrants. One factor is the financial instability that made amassment of capital to launch even a small microbusiness problematic for low-income residents. Access is exploring possible sources of capital, including small loans, as a remedy to this situation and is optimistic of achieving their goal for FY 2018. A total of 137 Individual Technical Assistance sessions and 13 Group Technical Assistance sessions were conducted. A total of 7 unduplicated clients completed program required Microenterprise Assistance Training. A total of 13 jobs were created. The following listing represents the total number of businesses assisted utilizing CDBG funds in prior years that were still open as of June 30, 2017: 9 businesses (FY 2016); 15 businesses (FY 2015); 6 businesses (FY 2014); and 8 businesses (FY 2013).

FY 2017 Year-End: Connections Housing Interim Bed Program provided 539 unduplicated individuals with temporary housing utilizing CDBG. ESG and City General Funds. The 134-bed interim program consisted of 85 beds for men and 49 beds for women. Residents had the opportunity to stay up to 90 days in the Interim program. The majority of the residents served were referred through PATH's Outreach team. The Outreach team used a variety of methods to engage the most vulnerable population. Some of these examples included, but were not limited to, direct street outreach, outreach events and coordinated outreach with other providers who were outreaching shared clients. All residents received two meals per day, cleaned linens, personal hygiene kits, undergarments, and clothing for those in need. The program offered onsite laundry machines, onsite access to educational and independent living skills groups, recovery supports, and numerous onsite community agencies. Each resident was offered individualized case management to meet their needs and were provided at a 20:1 staffing client ratio. This focused on, but was not limited to: 1) securing or increasing income/benefits; 2) securing permanent housing or longer-term transitional housing if needed: 3) securing or maintaining employment; and 4) referral to over 20 onsite community partners and off site referrals to community agencies. This fiscal year, PATH reduced the length of stay from 170 days to 120 days. Additional strategies were incorporated to case conferencing and collaboration in effort to guickly connect residents to permanent housing resources. Despite the difficulty of the housing market and lack of affordable housing, 169 residents transitioned into permanent housing and 102 moved into longer-term transitional housing.

Additionally, 33 of the exiting families moved in with family or friends on a temporary basis, 24 families exited to hotel/motel, 29 families exited to emergency shelter, 3 households exited to an institution, and 5 would not disclose their destination. It was confirmed that 59 of 66 households retained their permanent housing 3 months after their exit, with the remaining 7 families unable to be reached. Tracking the housing retention was challenging at times, as many did not leave contact information, changed their numbers, were unable to maintain their cell phone service, and/or did not respond or decline to report their whereabouts.

All youth enrolled and attending the job readiness program were required to be enrolled and attending school. Each week, staff called and verified attendance and youth were notified that they earned a violation if they did not fulfill this school requirement. As a result, there was a 100% increase in school attendance, helping to move youth toward high school graduation (as applicable). All youth were also encouraged to attend post-secondary education opportunities if they were close to graduating or had already graduated. Youth garden staff worked with school counselors, as well as 1 on 1 with a few students, in order to help them apply to college. There were three youth that graduated during the fiscal year after completing the garden program and will be attending college in the fall. In addition, seven youth served as peer youth supervisors to various garden cohorts. Each of these youth completed the program successfully and showed leadership skills. 1st & 2nd QTR: A total of 8 businesses (21 total business clients) were assisted from July 2017-December 2017.

For Fiscal Year 2018 close out, The Small Business Academy (SBA) was implemented as part of the Access Microenterprise Program. The SBA was designed to provide entrepreneurs and aspiring entrepreneurs with the information and resources they need in order to have a successful business. We had two SBAs, the first academy was in

partnership with Small Business Development Center (SBDC) that consisted of six weeks and in Spanish. Both agencies recruited Spanish speaker participants and a representative of SBDC conducted the lectures and had 22 participants. The second academy was a nine week bilingual course comprised of experts from various field of business, such as, Business Legal Entities, Business Owner: Salary and workers compensation responsibilities, Personal Financial Literacy. In partnership with the University of San Diego Business Department, we had two cohorts of the mentoring program, which aligned with the university's semester calendar. The purpose of the mentoring program is to partner each business client with two MBA students that will support the clients immediate need for their businesses. Access had a total of 31 microentrepreneurs client benefit from the mentoring program. The services provided consisted of developing a business plan, developing marketing strategies, determining service or product pricing, etc. Program enrollment of 55 unduplicated clients, Access was able to establish and expand 18 businesses.

For Fiscal Year 2018 closeout, 509 persons were assisted. impact that resulted. PATH interim shelter program served 509 unduplicated clients throughout this fiscal year and 432 clients exited throughout this fiscal year. Throughout this fiscal year PATH, interim shelter has helped 220 clients move into permanent/long-term shelter. Two hundred eighteen clients exited with one or more source of income and PATH interim program served 79 veterans with 33 of those veterans moving permanent/longer-term housing. PATH interim shelter was able to achieve successes in the interim shelter program with not only housing clients, but also connecting clients with families, connecting clients with mental health/medical health care needs and services/substance abuse services, as well as making sure clients are gaining income before leaving. For Fiscal Year 2018 closeout, 878 people were assisted. YWCA operates the Cortez Hill Family Center (CHFC) interim shelter program for single or dual-parent homeless families. Utilizing a client-centered and trauma informed approach, the program focuses on supporting families in accessing permanent housing. The program duration is a maximum of 90 days and the facility provides 47 individual housing units for families. During their stay, families work with their case managers to achieve housing readiness and connect with permanent housing resources. During fiscal year 2018, CHFC provided interim shelter to 270 families utilizing 53,057 bed nights. Those households equated to 878 individuals of which 329 were adults and 549 were children. During this year, 220 households exited the program with 45% securing longer term permanent or transitional housing. Our case managers worked closely with YWCA program staff and other service providers to help 77 families gain access to permanent housing and 22 families move to transitional housing. Additionally, 29 of the exiting families moved in with family or friends on a temporary basis, 44 families exited to a hotel/motel, 38 families exited to emergency shelter, 5 families exited to Safe Parking Program, and 5 would not disclose their destination.

Although 45% of the exiting families moved to longer-term housing, our clients continue to face severe barriers to obtaining permanent housing within the maximum 90-day program length. Many families are not able to support their family size in a rental unit due to lack of income, landlord restrictions, high cost of rental housing, and long or closed waitlists for affordable housing. For some families, the short-term program stay does not provide enough time for families to save sufficient money, clear up poor credit, pay off debt, increase employment opportunities or otherwise significantly improve their economic status. In addition, some families prefer to move into transitional housing programs for the continued supportive services or stay with family or friends for additional support. As the community focuses on increasing permanent housing solutions, we are optimistic that CHFC clients will continue to gain increased access to improved housing opportunities.

For Fiscal Year 2018 closeout, 7,360 individuals have been assisted. FY 18 was the busiest year to date at the Day Center with 7,360 unduplicated people walking through the door for services. This is the first time the Day Center has gone over 7,000 people in 3 years of operation. The Day Center went through many changes in the last year and, with the institution of a new Good Neighbor Policy, has become a model of cleanliness in the area. Increased security 24/7 was instrumental in keeping the outside trash free. The institution of new rules within the center (i.e. one cart per person, orange badge required for access, no bike parts allowed on premises, etc.) have made life at the center a more manageable and a pleasant experience for clients and staff Our case managers saw 813 clients for a total of 1,335 case management meetings. Our CMs work extremely hard to find temporary/permanent housing situations for clients that come to the center at all times of the day expecting immediate housing which is not always available. Our case managers had a 94% increased self-sufficiency rate for the year and had many success stories, which have been shared in our narratives throughout the year. Partner agencies that operated at the Day Center during the year included legal assistance, transportation assistance, identification assistance, health benefits outreach and care, and housing placement. Clients visited our partnering agencies 1,434 times this year. We continue to be successful in getting volunteer groups to come inside the center and distribute food daily helping keep our streets cleaner including group events that distributed used eyeglasses, shoes, food, clothing, blankets, sleeping bags, and haircuts. Family Health Centers of San Diego continues holding special Medi-Cal enrollment inside the Day Center and are additionally on site twice a week for testing and general medical outreach.

For Fiscal Year 2018 closeout, 1,701 individuals have been assisted. The City of San Diego Homeless Interim Housing Program operated all operational days during the 2018 fiscal year providing 350 beds of low barrier shelter (including HOT). The SVdPV Interim and HOT programs served 1,701 unique clients during the 2018 fiscal year. There was a decrease in Veterans served since December 2017 when the Veterans tent opened. For the months of October, November and December 2017, an average of 31 new Veterans were served monthly. For the months of January, February and March 2018, an average of 9 new Veterans were served monthly. The average length of stay for leavers, both OT and Interim beds, was 86 days with a median of 35 days. This spread, between average and median, highlights the polar nature of clients staying longer term or checking out quickly. Overall, 42% of clients checking out to Longer Term Housing, 69% for those who stayed over 90 days and 32% for those who stayed under 90 days. Clients that stayed over 90 days had a success rate to permanent housing destinations of 48%, this is compared to just 12% for those under 90 days. Matches to resources in CES continue to take extended time and SVdPV continues its practice of emailing longer-term clients waiting for a match to RTFH. Clients most affected by this are those that score a 4-5 for RR and 8-10 for PSH. These clients are passed over for resources for any new clients that enter the system and score higher than they do. New clients served during the 2017 grant year tested into the following CES categories:

PSH- 395 RR-470 ES-26

Safe Point San Diego services are provided from a small mobile van during three 3-hour intervals at two city-approved urban sites. In addition to dispensing clean syringes (one-for-one up to 50 per visit) and collecting used syringes (unlimited), SPSD prevents the transmission of HIV and HCV through individualized assistance for People Who Inject Drugs (PWID). New clients are provided with an identification card and may obtain two clean syringes and a starter kit, which provides supplies to help reduce the transmission of HIV and HCV, the first time they come to the program. During subsequent visits, participants receive supplemental harm reduction kits. Once registered in the program, clients may exchange syringes on a one-for-one basis. SPSD prevents the transmission of HIV and HCV through individualized assistance for: HIV and HCV testing, one-on-one harm reduction conversations and educational materials; case management; information and referrals to primary medical care and other social service programs; and facilitated referrals to detox and substance abuse treatment and rehabilitation programs. SPSD also reduces abscess and other injection-related injuries through provision of safer injection counseling and harm reduction kits. Throughout the program year, Community Financial Education and Services projects incorporated three key services: (1) one-on-one financial counseling and coaching, (2) classroom-based financial literacy trainings, and (3) access to affordable consumer loan and credit-building products. All 152 enrollees had access to the following services: Classroom-based financial literacy coursework; monthly small group workshops on banking, budgeting, and credit, offered in English, Somali, Swahili Arabic, and Spanish: 1:1 financial counseling covering a range of topics including bill-pay, bank account setup, and loan repayment; 1:1 financial coaching to develop and work toward financial goals; Interest-free credit-building loan products in the amounts of \$100-300; support and coaching through the loan application and repayment process; and to all other services included in IRCs Center for Financial Opportunity - microenterprise support, tax preparation, early employment, and career development services. Financial Literacy training proved every effective with over 90% of clients reporting increased knowledge in the subject matter and 65% of those without an existing bank account reported that they opened one following the training. Furthermore, one-on-one financial counseling and coaching led to 22 credit-building loans and corresponding rise in credit scores and 42 clients showed increases in net worth during follow-up budgeting services.

For Fiscal Year 2018 close out, 576 unduplicated students were provided new or continued access to tutoring and mentorship for the purpose of creating a suitable living environment. Some new students were served in and recruited through challenge assemblies, which focused on providing 8th grade students an idea of what it means to go to college. Other new students entered the program through a lengthy application process. Overall, all coaches served students and helped the students become college-ready through small-group and individualized tutoring, public speaking, and community events. These events happened nearly every school night of the year, in addition to many weekends. The lead achievement coaches for juniors helped the 11th grade students prepare for 12th grade by reviewing A-G requirements, prepping for standardized tests, and helping with class schedules to make sure 11th graders are making the best choices for them. While all of the coaches and coordinators implemented their respective programs and responsibilities, they also were able to serve the students better by starting to formalize a curriculum for our 8th-11th grade program. This work allowed staff to give personalized attention to students, as part of the curriculum was to create achievement plans so each student had a clear pathway to academic and Reality Changers success.

With CDBG providing funds to assist with employee salaries, SDSC has been able to reallocate monies to provide more services to participants. SDSC is now equipped to remove many barriers participants face during class and early employment. For example, SDSC now provides professional dress clothes and shoes. Any participant who is impacted by lack of transportation is provided with daily or monthly bus passes. For Fiscal Year 2018 close out, 93 youth individuals were assisted. 69 of the 93 youth enrolled successfully completed program, which was 15 more youth than contract required (a 74% success rate). The population of youth served at Second Chance face many barriers such as neglect. abuse, criminal backgrounds, addiction, and poverty that prevent them from accomplishing goals like completing their high school education. finding work and simply completing a 6 week program. As stated in CDBG grant application, there are additional program components aside from weekly garden work, garden sales and classroom instruction. Throughout the program, youth work with staff to develop skills like resume creation, job interview preparation, and learn how to navigate a job search through job development class. Although most of youth are still in school and unavailable to work full or part time, these classes help prepare youth for future employment. This past year, 70 youth received this job development training. In addition, once they have successfully completed the program, they have the option to return to the program as a youth supervisor, or work to formulate future education and career plans. As a result, this past year, 6 youth received unsubsidized employment after completing the program. An additional 9 youth returned to act as peer youth supervisors. Each of these youth completed the program successfully and showed leadership skills. They all received 3 days of training before starting their new roles as supervisors, as well as weekly training sessions to build leadership and skill development. The SCYG also aims to keep youth in school and help them move toward high school graduation. In order to do so, all youth participants are required to be enrolled in and attending school. Each week program staff call and verify school attendance. Youth are then held accountable by staff and teachers and can be dismissed from the program (a paid internship opportunity) if they do not stay on top of school work and attendance. This past year, 57 of the 69 (82%) youth who completed the program maintained and/or increased their attendance in school throughout the duration of the program. These school attendance and job attainment numbers reflect that we have met goal of having 80% of program graduates display significant gains in one of three project goal areas: a) achievement of high school diploma/GED; b) enrollment in post-secondary education; and/or c) attainment of unsubsidized employment.

In Nov TCC added a new Child Development Specialist to the Toddler classroom, which increased the # of hours of care available to 18-35 month old children. As a result, there was a 37% increase to the # of childcare hrs provided from Nov 2017 to Jun 2018, compared to Jun-Nov previous year. In Mar and Apr two additional Child Development Specialists were added, allowing us to further increase childcare hours. In all TCC was able to offer an additional 2,426 hrs of childcare throughout the contract term. Services provided included: Developmental Services - Children are assessed using the Bailey's psychological assessment measuring child development across all areas. The assessment dictates support services provided on site (e.g. speech/language, dyadic and play therapy) and the referrals made to community resources. Academic Programs - One-on-one tutoring is provided to assist with homework and improve academic skills. Parental Involvement - Parenting classes are offered to increase knowledge of child development, and means to foster positive relationships. Enrichment Activities - Children are provided a variety of recreational and community-based activities, students play tennis 1x week and go on field trips (e.g. to Belmont Park, the beach, and movies).

The YSCM began working with the Human Resource Department conducting and attending outreach and recruitment events in the community as well in-house planned events. The targeted outcome for this grant was for Urban Corps'¿¿ Youth Success Case Manager to identify and serve 140 youth during the 2017-2018 grant period. The YSCM identified, interviewed, served and conducted 209 Individual Development Plans with new and unduplicated City of San Diego youth between the ages of 18 to 26. The YSCM prepared a case file for each participant and ensured that all who were identified met grant eligibility requirements. All recruits attended an orientation that Urban Corps refers to as COMET (Corpsmember Orientation Motivation Education and Training) where program policies and procedures, mental toughness and professional development were discussed in detail. The purpose of COMET is to form foundational knowledge that will lead successful completion of the program. During COMET, YSCM assessed each participants' basic needs and provided resources according to their needs. Resources and referrals included but were not limited to shelters, counseling, drug and alcohol treatment centers, Medi-cal/EBT, and childcare. During this grant period, there were 29 Medi-Cal/EBT enrollments, 50 referrals to counseling, and 8 obtained a driver¿¿s license. 129 MTS passes were provided through this grant and 80 were paid by Urban Corps as leveraged funds. Eighteen participants received \$20 clothing packs, 50 received CPR training and 30 were able to receive a free Hepatitis A Vaccine as a preventative measure since their vocational/job training exposed them to potential environmental hazards.

Furthermore, the YSCM conducted daily Life Skills Workshops where students were taught various skills geared towards becoming a more independent, successful and productive member of society. In addition, Urban Corps partnered with the San Diego Continued Education Center to provide on-site basic English vocational skills classes to all English Language Learners. This partnership has proven to be successful as Urban Corps'¿¿ statistics show that a greater number of English Language Learners were able to transition to Mainstream English classes at a faster rate as compared to previous years. This is also due in part to Urban Corps'¿¿ Charter School hiring more trained professionals and

2017 1ST QTR & 2ND QTRS: As of December 2017, 17 individuals have been assisted. 3RD QTR: As of March 2018, 49 individuals have been assisted.

For Fiscal Year 2018 closeout, 105 individuals were assisted. The UrbanLife Agriculture Project funded by CDBG served 105 LMI youth in City Heights and Southeastern San Diego, including the following activities for FY 2017-18: Four student cohorts providing a majority of LMI youth in City Heights and Southeastern San Diego with workforce training that focused on the Equipped for the Future Framework (EFF)-defined skills (communication, interpersonal, decision-making, and lifelong learning) needed to find quality jobs in the future, vocational training and leadership development. Through weekly work opportunities maintaining the urban farm and learning about growing food, monthly educational sessions on resume creation, application skills, communication skills, etc. and one-on-one meetings with both YMCA staff and Urban Life staff, the youth involved in the Urban Agriculture program received valuable workforce training and experience. Developed a strategic partnership with Hoover High School Sustainable Academy of Building and Engineering (SABE), where over 75 students received workforce development curriculum (as described above), designed and built four prototypes for the rooftop garden hydroponics growing system. Sponsored a community service day for youth and families in the neighborhood at the Copley-Price Family YMCA, increasing awareness and education around urban farming, biointensive methods of food production, nutrition. Students and community members learned about the growth process from propagation through cultivation of plants through the hydroponics system. Together they installed the hydroponics units that the Hoover High School SABE students designed and built. All clients served received workforce training curriculum designed to prepare youth to become gainfully employed, incorporating a nationally recognized framework with leadership development and empowerment tools. All clients served received nutrition, food justice, and urban agriculture education through hands-on learning and community service in our urban farming locations. Hoover High School SABE students participated in hands-on, project based STEM learning through design and building the hydroponics prototypes for the rooftop garden. The design of the Rooftop garden will promote wellness education to all visitors, through signage and self-guided tours.

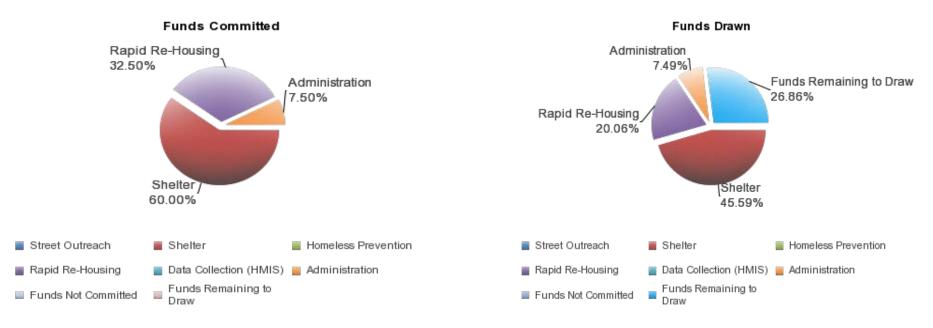

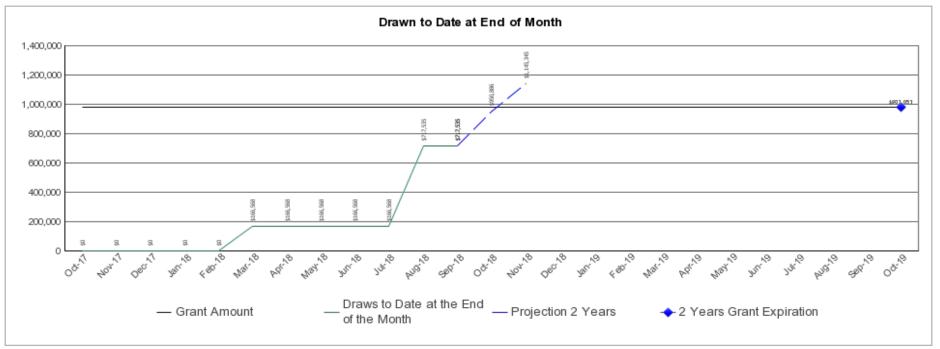
