**Public Comments and Staff Responses**

Following are the questions and comments received on the Draft Fiscal Year (FY) 2022 CAPER and the responses provided by staff, where warranted. The Draft FY 2022 CAPER was made available for public review from September 2, 2022 and September 16, 2022. During the public review period, the Draft FY 2022 CAPER was posted online for viewing at the City of San Diego's CDBG Program website: ([www.sandiego.gov/cdbg](http://www.sandiego.gov/cdbg)). The CAPER was available through the City's website, City libraries and the following publications: Daily Transcript, Voice and Viewpoint and El Latino. The public was provided the opportunity to send comments via email to [cdbg@sandiego.gov](mailto:cdbg@sandiego.gov), and to make public comments at one of three virtual (or hybrid) public meetings: the September 7, 2022 Public Safety and Livable Neighborhoods Committee meeting, the September 8, 2022 Consolidated Plan Advisory Board meeting, and the September 20, 2022 City Council hearing.

**September 7, 2022 Public Safety and Livable Neighborhoods Committee Meeting**

**Councilmember Raul Campillo, District 7**

Councilmember Campillo thanked staff for the critical report highlighting the City's successes and identifying gaps to fill. He highlighted District 7 organizations that were served, including the Workforce Partnership, ACCESS, and Voices for Children. He acknowledged the good work they do for his constituents and he is grateful for City staff and the funding.

**Councilmember Marni von Wilpert, District 5**

Councilmember von Wilpert thanked staff for the briefing ahead of time. She wanted to highlight the importance of fighting housing discrimination. She is proud the City is partnering with the Legal Aid Society to address those concerns.

**Council President Pro Tem Monica Montgomery Steppe, District 4**

Council President Pro Tem Montgomery Steppe thanked staff for their work with HUD and thanked the Consolidated Plan Advisory Board for their hard work. She asked staff to repeat the information around public comment periods.

**Staff Response:** Ms. Michele Marano, Community Development Coordinator, responded that the public comment period is September 2<sup>nd</sup> through September 16<sup>th</sup>. There are also copies of the CAPER at various libraries throughout the city. Written



*comments are accepted and can be sent to the address posted on the public notice with the CAPER at the libraries. Members of the public can also attend the CPAB meeting or the City Council meeting. The City Council hearing will be used to collect feedback, even though it is technically after the public comment period has ended.*

**September 8, 2022 Consolidated Plan Advisory Board (CPAB) Meeting**

**CPAB Member, Rich Thesing**

Mr. Thesing commented that it was a nice presentation and appreciated the staff work that went into putting together the presentation as well as working on the projects.

**CPAB Member, Eileen Gonzales**

Ms. Gonzales stated this is the part of CPAB she looks forward to every year. She likes to see the programs they've approved and funded accomplishments. She commented that it appears that the program is on schedule and close to accomplishing the goals and it is exciting to see.

***Staff Response:** Ms. Michele Marano, Community Development Coordinator, thanked Ms. Gonzales and Mr. Thesing and said this is the result of CPAB's hard work to get the non-profits funded quickly and deploy funds where they are needed the most.*

**September 20, 2022 City Council Hearing**

**Public Comments**

**Ricardo Flores, LISC San Diego**

Mr. Flores brought to the City Council's attention that the federal government is asking how the City will affirmatively further fair housing or how it will desegregate neighborhoods. The Consolidated Plan states the City will implement policies from the San Diego Regional Analysis of Impediments to Fair Housing and use the Housing Element passed by the City last year. Mr. Flores asked Council to implement AFFH and to desegregate living patterns in the city and strongly encouraged Council to work with organizations like his to do so. He thanked Economic Development Department staff for all of their work to put money into the communities.

**Joyce Cenata**

Ms. Cenata thanked staff for the presentation and report. She asked if comments after today will be going to HUD. She noted that the CAPER attachments -- the ESG Sage Report, the Fair Housing Report and the Section 3 Report are not attached. She would like for the attachments to be for public review. That data is extremely valuable for equity for the sake of collaboration and transparency.

**Catherine Rhodes**

Ms. Rhodes agreed with previous speaker Joyce. She stated that this report is unhelpful without the attachments, specifically the IDIS reports. She commented that in addition to the IDIS reports, the Community Development Block Grant activity summary, the accomplishments summary, the HOME summary, CDBG financial summary, COVID summary, and the ESG summary were also not made public. She stated that she doesn't know how much cash the City has on hand from these programs. She added that she cannot give comment on what is in the report if the information is not provided. She also asked what the starting fund balance was, what the total revenue and expenses were, and what the ending fund balance was

**Council Comments**

**Councilmember Raul Campillo, District 7**

Councilmember Campillo thanked staff for their work on the report and highlighted that there was significant progression towards many of the goals outlined in the CAPER. He commented that the City seems to be falling behind on affordable housing progress. There was the goal of having 700 new affordable units by FY 2024 and it seems that we have 167 units accounted for. He asked whether we were on track to meet that goal by FY 2024's end.

**Staff Response:** *Mr. Colin Miller, San Diego Housing Commission, responded that there are a number of projects that are under construction. We have had delays with materials being delivered on site but we remain guardedly optimistic that we will achieve that goal of 700 units by the end of FY 2024. He does not currently have the total number of units, but he will pull it and get back to Councilmember Campillo.*



***Supplemental City Staff Response**, this was not provided during the Council meeting, but included here for reference: The Consolidated Plan goal of 700 new affordable housing units during the 5-year period was a reasonable estimate based on the information available at the time the Consolidated Plan was drafted and approved. The estimate was based on the number of new affordable housing units in the pipeline and then extrapolated for the Consolidated Plan period. During the 5-year period, certain new affordable housing communities have been completed, and a **portion** of the units have been HOME-funded rather than **all** the units in the community. Additionally, if you refer to the Consolidated Plan goal of 140 rehabilitated rental units during the 5-year period, you will see that the City has over-delivered by rehabilitating over 600 rental units to preserve their affordability. Cumulatively, the new/rehabilitated rental unit goal is 840 residential units and to-date the City has reported 784 units (which is 93% of the goal).*

**Council President Pro Tem Monica Montgomery Steppe, District 4**

Councilmember Montgomery Steppe thanked the Consolidated Plan Advisory Board and wanted to make sure the public was aware of the technical assistance opportunities available with this funding. It has been important for her that this funding reaches far and although it is onerous to apply it helps organizations build their capacity. She asked staff to share updates on the planned assistance.

***Staff Response:** Ms. Michele Marano, Community Development Coordinator, indicated EDD is planning to release the Fiscal Year 2024 notice of funding availability at the end of this week or early next week and there will be an announcement for a technical assistance workshop. It will be virtual, and staff will follow up with the date as well as post it online. It will be shared with the CDBG distribution list as well. The City will also be hosting technical assistance appointments with any nonprofit organization interested in receiving more information. They will be scheduled in the month of October and be 30 minutes each. Organizations can attend up to two appointments.*

**Councilmember Marni Von Wilpert, District 5**

Councilmember Von Wilpert thanked the group for the presentation on for answering her questions at the PSLN committee meeting. She extended a personal thank you to Michele Marano for her work assisting her constituents with the process and echoed her colleague's call to the federal government to build more military housing in San Diego. Building affordable housing is key and important but finding homes and providing vouchers to those who are looking for housing is equally



important. She asked whether there were any updates on the landlord engagement programs or voucher assistance.

**Staff Response:** *Need to defer the question to the San Diego Housing Commission as that is outside of the scope of the programs covered by the CAPER.*

**Councilmember Joe LaCava, District 1**

Councilmember LaCava thanked staff and Ms. Marano for their commitment to making the process for CPAB efficient and highlighted that there are vacancies on the board and urged his colleagues to fill those vacancies. He wants to make sure each district is contributing to this process. Mr. LaCava raised the issue of the attachments to be included, will they be posted on the Economic Development website before it is submitted to HUD? Also asked what is the working relationship with HUD? Do we have a good strong working relationship with HUD and are they satisfied with what we are doing?

**Staff Response:** *The City typically does not post the attachments before the report is submitted to HUD because there is a bit of a lag in the IDIS system. When we draft the CAPER for public comment, we are reporting projects that are closed or soon to be closed, however we are still conducting draws during the public comment period and making sure those funds are reimbursed to the City. Details may not be reflected in the IDIS report until the last minute. The other attachments are primarily informational reports that are pulled down from a system, so we generally attach them at the end. However, they are all available online after the CAPER is submitted to HUD and this is a comment we will take to heart and see if there is a way to create a fabricated internal deadline to report up to a certain date so that this information can be publicly available sooner. It has been something we have looked at in the past. We received positive monitoring results in the most recent HUD monitoring. We just had our action plan for FY23 approved by HUD and received the grant agreements this morning. We have a great working relationship with our regional office. If there are any questions on documents, we have been able to respond to them quickly.*

Ms. Marano,

I am deeply concerned that another year has gone by and the City of San Diego's FY 2022 CAPER does not meaningfully address the goals of the US Department of Housing and Urban Development and the CA Department of Housing and Community Development to implement Affirmatively Furthering Fair Housing (AFFH) - eliminate barriers to segregation. This is especially troubling in light of the fact that the 2020-2024 Consolidated Plan's first goal is to "Increase and preserve affordable rental and homeowner housing to improve access to housing opportunities that reflect community needs, including but not limited to, opportunities in close proximity to transit, employment, and community services."

The City of San Diego's 2020-2024 Consolidated Plan states that the City will "remove or ameliorate the negative effects of public policies that serve as barriers" to housing by "Implementing recommendations from the San Diego Regional Analysis of Impediments to Fair Housing Choice."

But in reviewing the San Diego Regional Analysis of Impediments to Fair Housing Choice 2020 the document states the the City will "expand the housing stock to accommodate the varied housing needs of different groups" as part of the 6th cycle Housing Element. Unfortunately, the City did not provide a plan during the 6th cycle Housing Element on how it would implement Affirmatively Furthering Fair Housing.

The effects of racial segregation are profound. It is of great concern that the City does not have a plan on how to change the pattern of segregation that the City implemented in the 1920's as its zoning ordinances.

Affirmatively Furthering Fair Housing was passed by Congress in 1968. The City of San Diego has been provided 54 years to dismantle their segregated living patterns. I strongly urge the City to work with community groups like LISC San Diego to finally begin addressing the apartheid that we live in.

Dear Mr. Flores:

Thank you for contacting the City of San Diego, Economic Development Department to provide a comment on the draft FY 2022 Consolidated Annual Performance and Evaluation Report (CAPER).

The Economic Development Department administers programs funded in whole or in part with entitlement grant funds provided to the City by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), including the Community Development Block Grant Program. Pursuant to HUD regulations, and as a condition of receiving these entitlement grant funds, the City is obligated to affirmatively further fair housing. "Affirmatively furthering fair housing" is generally defined as taking significant actions, that are designed and can be reasonably expected, to achieve a material positive change that affirmatively furthers fair housing by, for example, increasing fair housing choice or decreasing disparities in access to opportunity.

You are correct that the City's FY 2020 – FY 2024 Consolidated Plan includes a goal to "increase and preserve affordable rental and homeowner housing to improve access to housing opportunities that reflect community needs, including but not limited to, opportunities in close proximity to transit, employment, and community services."

In 2020, the City, collaborating with the other County jurisdictions, completed the Analysis of Impediments for Fair Housing Choice (AI). The current AI can be found here:  
<https://www.sandiego.gov/sites/default/files/fhaifinal2020.pdf>.

The AI identifies both regional and jurisdiction-specific impediments to fair housing choice, which the City then uses to create a workplan that addresses these identified barriers (see Chapter 7, page 219 of the AI). Each year, the City reports on the progress towards addressing the identified barriers and includes the information in the CAPER. For example, the FY 2021 Fair Housing Report is located here:  
[https://www.sandiego.gov/sites/default/files/cosdfy21caper\\_att4.pdf](https://www.sandiego.gov/sites/default/files/cosdfy21caper_att4.pdf). The FY 2022 Fair Housing Report is included in the FY 2022 CAPER as Attachment 4.

In response to your comment, "It is of great concern that the City does not have a plan on how to change the pattern of segregation...", please refer to Section CR-35 of the FY 2022 CAPER, as well as page 12 of 14 of the Fair Housing Report at Attachment 4. As described, the City of San Diego announced a new citywide initiative called "Homes for All of Us" (<https://www.sandiego.gov/planning/work/housing-action-package>).

The initiative includes three components: a new community plan update framework called Blueprint San Diego (<https://www.sandiego.gov/blueprint-sd>) to help meet the City's housing and climate action goals, the creation of a Middle-Income Housing Working Group (<https://www.sandiego.gov/planning/work/middle-income-housing>), and the Housing Action Package (<https://www.sandiego.gov/planning/work/housing-action-package>).

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In March 2022, the first Housing Action Package under the "Homes for All of Us" initiative was signed into law by Mayor Gloria. This package included:

- Senate Bill 9 implementation to split single-family lots into two lots and permitting up to two new homes on each lot.
- Accessory Dwelling Unit Ordinance Amendments to make the ordinance consistent with SB 9 on privacy, landscaping, and development impact fees.
- Affordable housing in all communities to encourage construction in communities with little to no affordable housing. Homes must be built near transit and in high resource areas.
- Employee Housing Incentive Program to provide incentives for non-residential developments to pay into a San Diego Housing Commission fund to develop homes.
- Live/Work flexibility to further facilitate the production of live/work units to allow for more work-from-home and telework opportunities.
- Housing at City facilities to allow by-right affordable and middle-income housing developments on existing and new publicly owned sites.
- Housing Accessibility Program to provide incentives to include more accessible housing for people with disabilities, with adequate space in kitchens and bathrooms and accessible routes throughout the building.
- Housing for families by providing incentives for multifamily housing developments to build home with three- or more bedrooms.

Your letter also mentions that the City's 6<sup>th</sup> cycle of its Housing Element did not provide a plan for affirmatively furthering fair housing. The Housing Element is not within the purview of the CAPER or the Economic Development Department. The City of San Diego Planning Department is responsible for reporting updates on the Housing Element, and any progress made toward fair housing efforts as identified in the Housing Element, to the State of California. Your comments have been referred to the Planning Department for further response.
