Subrecipients were also required to include the Section 3 clauses in its entirety within their bid documents and all executed agreements resulting from construction contracts awarded by Subrecipients to General Contractors, including all executed agreements between the General Contractors and Subcontractors. Section 3 requirements were discussed during all Pre-Construction Meetings conducted. General Contractors reported efforts to request for apprentices through unions and training agencies.
