ORAL COMMENTS

Following are the oral comments provided by members of the public, the City Council and the Consolidated Plan Advisory Board (CPAB) during the 3 public meetings for the Draft FY 2019 Annual Action Plan. Where warranted, the response from staff follows the comment.

MARCH 21, 2018 – PUBLIC SAFETY & LIVABLE NEIGHBORHOODS (PSLN) COUNCIL COMMITTEE

On March 21, 2018 the PSLN Committee forwarded the FY 2019 AAP Allocations to the full City Council with a recommendation to approve. Although, this hearing occurred outside of the official public comment period from April 6th – May 5th, 2018 it is included as the FY 2019 Allocations are directly associated with FY 2019 Annual Action Plan.

Al Abdallah, (Submitted a speaker's slip in favor)

- Mr. Abdallah, representing Urban League of San Diego County, recommended that the PSLN Council Committee approve the allocations for FY 2019.

Ken Malbrough, (Submitted a speaker's slip in favor)

- Mr. Malbrough, Chair of the Consolidated Plan Advisory Board, asked the PSLN Council Committee to accept the report as written and thanked Economic Development staff for their work with non-profits and reviewers during the application process.

Erik Tiklemeier (Submitted a speaker's slip in favor)

- Mr. Tiklemeier, representing City Heights Community Development Corporation, encouraged the PSLN Council Committee to approve the funding to non-profits

working to support LMI families with affordable housing and economic development needs.

Bernie Miles (Submitted a speaker's slip in favor)

- Mr. Miles, representing Episcopal Community Services, was thankful for the CDBG program and the chance to expand services for the homeless with mental health issues.

Marcy Rodin (Submitted a speaker's slip in favor)

- Ms. Rodin, representing Ronald McDonald House Charities, was thankful for being awarded CDBG funding and appreciates the impact the program has with supporting LMI families through extended hospital stays.

Roxana Mejia (Submitted a speaker's slip in favor)

- Ms. Mejia, representing SD Habitat for Humanity, expressed gratitude for being awarded CDBG funding for the organization's neighborhood revitalization services.

Heidi Kone (Submitted a speaker's slip in favor)

- Ms. Kone, representing Meals on Wheels, stated that with CDBG funding the organization will be able to deliver meals to extremely low-income seniors and asked for PSLN Council Committee to vote in favor.

Veronica Baker (Submitted a speaker's slip in favor)

- Ms. Baker, representing Second Chance, was thankful for the CDBG program and the ability to fund supportive services for recently incarcerated individuals.

Sonia Diaz (Submitted a speaker's slip in favor)

- Ms. Diaz, representing Kitchens for Good, expressed appreciation for the PSLN Council Committee consideration of the CDBG projects and hopes to be able to continue implementation of the program aimed at reducing food waste, poverty and hunger in the City of San Diego.

Julie Raefield (Submitted a speaker's slip in favor)

- Ms. Raefield, representing Center for Community Solutions, stated her support the CDBG funding recommendations that will allow the expansion of supportive services for domestic violence victims.

Anthony White (Submitted a speaker's slip in favor)

- Mr. White, representing Family Health Centers, voiced his support of the CDBG program and the ability to better serve LMI individuals across the City of San Diego.

Carla Camacho (Submitted a speaker's slip in favor)

- Ms. Camacho, representing Ocean Discovery, communicated the organization's thankfulness for CDBG funding and urged the PSLN Council Committee to support the recommended allocations.

Ellen Schmeding (Submitted a speaker's slip in favor)

- Ms. Schmeding, representing St. Pauls' Senior Services, thanked the PSLN Council Committee for their time and asked for their support in approving CDBG funding to ensure an effective and sanitary living environment for LMI seniors.

William Zaconne (Submitted a speaker's slip in favor)

- Mr. Zaconne, representing Interfaith Shelter Network of San Diego, expressed appreciation for the funding and would appreciate the PSLN Council Committee support.

Tiernan Seaver (Submitted a speaker's slip in favor)

- Ms. Seaver, representing Casa Familiar, thanked the PSLN Council Committee for their time and asked for their support in approving the CDBG funding to provide financial literacy services to LMI individuals.

Lea Cogen (Submitted a speaker's slip in favor)

- Ms Cogen, representing Urban Corps of San Diego County, shared a story of a LMI homeowner who expressed thankfulness for the CDBG funded single family home rehabilitation program.

Ray Uzeta (Submitted a speaker's slip in favor)

- Mr. Uzeta, representing Chicano Federation of San Diego County, thanked the City for making the CDBG program accessible.

Heather Hansen (Submitted a speaker's slip in favor)

- Ms. Hansen, representing International Rescue Committee, was appreciative for two projects being awarded CDBG funding and values the impact the programs have assisting LMI individuals with job readiness skills and small business entrepreneurship.

Dante Duaz (Submitted a speaker's slip in favor)

- Mr. Duaz, representing Union of Pan Asian Communities, stated his gratefulness for being awarded and thanked the Consolidated Plan Advisory Board for their time in reviewing applications.

Heather Hawking (Submitted a speaker's slip in favor)

- Ms. Hawkins, representing Jewish Family Services, expressed her thankfulness for the CDBG program and the City of San Diego in providing funding for housing services for homeless individuals.

Nadia Tabatabaeepour (Submitted a speaker's slip in favor)

- Ms. Tabatabaeepour, representing La Maestra Family Clinic, stated her appreciation for the CDBG program and requested the PSLN Council Committee support.

Councilmember Georgette Gomez

- Ms. Gomez thanked the Consolidated Plan Advisory Board (CPAB) for their time and dedication in evaluating proposals.
- Ms. Gomez also thanked the work of City of San Diego staff for their creativity and support of nonprofit organizations in accessing CDBG funds through technical assistance appointments, workshops, and the emerging organizations category. Ms. Gomez noted that thirteen new organizations have been selected for funding in FY 2019.
- Ms. Gomez asked about the total allocation for Homeless Services for CDBG funds.
- Ms. Gomez noted that the Public Services application category is traditionally the most competitive and asked why some organizations were not awarded within it.

Staff response: At the time of this Council Committee meeting, the staff recommendation included an allocation of \$12.9 million to homeless services. This allocation included a \$10 million line-item dedicated to the acquisition and/or rehabilitation of a facility serving the homeless or permanent housing. Combined with ESG funds, estimated to be around \$980,000, an estimated total of \$13.8 Million Dollars was recommended for Homeless Services.

(Subsequent to this Committee meeting, the priority for the expenditure of the \$10 million line-

item shifted from a facility serving the homeless to a permanent housing facility.) The Public Service category has historically been oversubscribed as a result of over demand for the available funds.

Councilmember Lorie Zapf

- Ms. Zapf expressed her appreciation for the work of the Consolidated Plan Advisory Board (CPAB) and asked Ken Malbrough, CPAB chair, to speak to the number of awarded organizations for Public Services. Ms. Zapf also asked about establishing maximums to the funding request to ensure more organizations are awarded funding.

Mr. Malbrough, stated that given the oversubscription to the Public Services category and the HUD maximum allowable amount on Public Services projects funding has historically resulted in the majority of Public Service applications being denied funding. Mr. Malbrough added that the CPAB is considering a variety of measures to advance a greater number of projects and diversity in the organizations awarded CDBG funding.

- Ms. Zapf asked how the 2019 Public Service CDBG allocation was able to increase substantially from prior years.

Staff response: As outlined in the Second Substantial Amendment to the FY 2015-2019 Consolidated Plan, the primary reason is due to the increase in CDBG Program Income received by the City of San Diego. As such, the Reinvestment Initiative approved in December 2016 by City Council, has allowed for an increase in Public Services projects and programs.

Ms. Zapf stated that the decision to set aside a substantial amount of Public Services dollars to Homeless Services resulted in a lower amount of nonprofit programs aimed at preventing homelessness. Ms. Zapf asked for the consideration of paring back the homeless set aside to support LMI individuals in a variety of census tracts and secure other resources to support the homeless.

Staff response: The \$1.3 million set-aside in the Public Services budget is established in Council Policy 700-02 and can be addressed during our next Consolidated Plan in terms of establishing priorities and evaluating needs. Also, this year we are investing \$1.4 million dollars in workforce development in coordination with the San Diego Workforce Partnership.

Councilmember Chris Ward

- Mr. Ward understands the importance of CDBG funding and the impact it has on the various communities throughout the City.
- Mr. Ward also thanked the hard work of the Consolidated Plan Advisory Board (CPAB) in evaluating the proposals.

Councilmember Barbara Bry

- Ms. Bry thanked Ken Malbrough and the rest of CPAB and commended staff on all the hard work in compiling the information.
- Ms. Bry stated that she was impressed by the breadth of organizations and programs funded in FY 2019.

Councilmember Chris Cate

- Mr. Cate thanked the CPAB and staff on the hard work in evaluating the proposals.
- Mr. Cate asked about the expected repayment period, specifically the timeframe to clarify for nonprofits the availability of CDBG in years to come.

Staff response: The Office of Inspector General (OIG) repayment ends in 2020 and the long-term debt agreement goes until 2030, which are two separate agreement schedules. Funding is expected to dip over the next few years and staff is working towards strengthening nonprofits capacity to secure outside funding.

APRIL 11, 2018 – CONSOLIDATED PLAN ADVISORY BOARD (CPAB) MEETING

The CPAB recommended the Draft FY 19 AAP. No public comments were made or received in regards to the Annual Action Plan.

APRIL 23, 2018 – CITY COUNCIL MEETING**Martha Walsh (Submitted a speaker's slip in favor)**

- Ms. Walsh stated that she was in favor of the proposed action and questioned the effectiveness of the services and facilities to support homeless individuals.

Vicki Granowitz, Former CPAB Chair (Submitted a speaker's slip in favor)

- Ms. Granowitz expressed her appreciation for City staff's creativeness.
- Ms. Granowitz expressed her desire for Capital Improvement Projects to be exclusively focused on providing consistent and affordable housing.

Julie Raefield (Submitted a speaker's slip in favor)

- Ms. Raefield, representing Center for Community Solutions, thanked the City Council for their time and stated her support the CDBG funding recommendations that will allow the expansion of supportive services for domestic violence victims.

Richard McNamara (Submitted a speaker's slip in favor)

- Mr. McNamara stated his appreciation for the improvement in the process for awarding CDBG funds.
- Mr. McNamara also expressed his support for the FY 2019 Annual Action Plan.

Anthony White (Submitted a speaker's slip in favor)

- Mr. White, representing Family Health Centers, urged the City Council to support the FY 2019 Annual Action Plan and the ability to better serve LMI individuals across the City of San Diego.

Elizabeth Christian (Submitted a speaker's slip in favor)

- Ms. Christian, representing Jewish Family Services, expressed her thankfulness for the CDBG program and the City of San Diego in expanding funding for wraparound services for homeless individuals.

Jared Ocampo (Submitted a speaker's slip in favor)

- Mr. Ocampo, representing Ocean Discovery, communicated the organization's thankfulness for CDBG funding and urged the City Council to support the Annual Action Plan.
- Mr. Ocampo stated that the City of San Diego has been a catalyst for Ocean Discovery and allowing the expansion of youth services.

Karen Nutzen (Submitted a speaker's slip in favor)

- Ms. Nutzen, representing La Maestra Community Health Centers, communicated the organization's thankfulness to the Council Members and urged the City Council to vote in favor of the FY 2019 Annual Action Plan.

Veronica Baker (Submitted a speaker's slip in favor)

- Ms. Baker, representing Second Chance, expressed her thankfulness to the City of San Diego and the ability to utilize CDBG to fund supportive services for recently incarcerated individuals.

Heather Garcia (Submitted a speaker's slip in favor)

- Ms. Garcia, representing Casa Familiar, thanked the City Council for their time and asked for their support in approving the CDBG funding to provide financial literacy services to LMI individuals. Ms. Garcia encouraged the Councilmembers to support the FY 2019 Annual Action Plan.

Richard Sigas, (Submitted a speaker's slip in favor)

- Mr. Sigas, representing Jabobs Center for Innovation, thanked the City Council for their time and expressed his organization's appreciation of CDBG support.

H. Puentes, (Submitted a speaker's slip in favor)

- Mr. Puentes, representing Connect, expressed his support the FY 2019 Annual Action Plan.

Francisco Martinez, (Submitted a speaker's slip in favor)

- Mr. Martinez, representing Barrio Logan College Institute, thanked the City Council for their support of CDBG programs, which will allow the expansion of higher education services to LMI individuals.

Sonia Diaz (Submitted a speaker's slip in favor)

- Ms. Diaz, representing Kitchens for Good, expressed appreciation for the City Council's support to support the organization's Culinary Apprenticeship program.

Elizabeth Schott (Submitted a speaker's slip in favor)

- Ms. Schott, representing Accion, stated her thankfulness for the City Council's time in considering the FY 2019 Annual Action Plan and would appreciate the support of Councilmembers to continue to provide access to capital to LMI business owners.

Tony Olias, Audy Decastro (Submitted a speaker's slip in favor)

- Expressed appreciation for the CDBG funding recommendation for the Bay Terraces Senior Community Center and recommended City Council approve the FY 2019 Annual Action Plan.

Council President Myrtle Cole

- Ms. Cole thanked those who supported the Bay Terraces Senior Community Center and that Council District 4 has been waiting for a substantial amount of time for a

senior center. Ms. Cole expressed appreciation for the proposed improvements to the center.

Councilmember Chris Cate

- Mr. Cate stated that the hard work of staff and the CPAB is evident with such broad support for the proposed allocations.
- Mr. Cate asked what could be expected in terms of funding of the next few years. Mr. Cate also asked about any potential restrictions in funding caps according to HUD going into the next Consolidated Plan period.

Staff response: This is a unique situation and agencies should be aware that this is a one-time funding increase that allowed for the surge in Public Service projects. Staff also clarified that the two main restrictions placed on CDBG funding are the 20% administrative and 15% public services caps.

Councilmember Georgette Gomez

- Ms. Gomez acknowledged staff efforts in going above and beyond in conducting outreach and improving accessibility for nonprofits.
- Ms. Gomez stated that she is supportive of the requested action to support LMI individuals.

Councilmember David Alvarez

- Mr. Alvarez also expressed the importance of establishing the next Consolidated Plan to determine the spending priorities for the next five years.
- Mr. Alvarez asked to clarify the line item on the \$10 Million Dollar Homeless Facility / Permanent Housing acquisition and rehabilitation. Mr. Alvarez asked whether there is an exact facility in mind or if this was currently a set-aside given the need for community dialogue. Mr. Alvarez asked that the Council be considered and referred pertinent information as soon as possible.

Staff response: The \$10 million line-item is a placeholder for a future homeless facility or permanent housing project. Any expenditure of these funds for a facility acquisition to address homelessness would come to Council at a later date for approval. Today's action gives the City authority to allocate funds for these types of acquisition and rehabilitation activities. If funds are

not committed to a homeless facility then they would be contributed to the affordable housing revolving loan fund previously approved by Council for an affordable, permanent housing project.

Councilmember Chris Ward

- Mr. Ward thanked staff and the CPAB in their efforts towards community improvements. Mr. Ward also thanked Ms. Vicki Granowitz, Former CPAB Chair for her efforts and time invested in the process.
- Mr. Ward stated the City is balancing a wide variety of important goals from sustainability, homelessness and workforce development. Mr. Ward noted that CDBG funding is important in allowing for greater range of services to be provided.

Councilmember Barbara Bry

- Ms. Bry thanked staff and the CPAB in their efforts in this process.
- Ms. Bry expressed appreciation for the number of workforce development and economic development projects to support an inclusive economy.

Councilmember Lorie Zapf

- Ms. Zapf stated that she was grateful for this unique year with CDBG funding going towards the work of a wide coverage of nonprofit organizations.
- Ms. Zapf also expressed her support for CDBG funds being used for nonprofits and hopes to secure alternative funding for homeless services to return CDBG funds to LMI individuals through nonprofit work. Ms. Zapf stated that workforce development and youth services will work towards preventing homelessness.

Item was approved unanimously 9-0.
