## Background

- The Statement of Budgetary Principles was first put into place in FY 2008 to address issues of budgetary authority
- The Principles represent an annual agreement between the City Council and the Mayor, which we recommend be continued in FY 2020
- IBA Report #19-17 includes the FY 2020 Statement of Budgetary Principles
- FY 2020 Principles closely mirror those adopted in FY 2019 with minor revisions to dates

## **Highlights of the FY 2020 Principles**

- The Mayor, or his designee, will provide reports to the Council on a quarterly basis regarding the administration of the affairs of the City
- Neither the Council nor the Mayor has unilateral authority to make changes to the spending authority contained in the FY 2020 Budget
- The Mayor shall in good faith fulfill the legislative intent reflected in the FY 2020 Budget

# Highlights of the FY 2020 Principles (cont'd)

- The Council shall have no authority to make or adopt changes to the FY 2020 Budget without first receiving a funding recommendation of the Mayor
- The "Structural Budget Deficit Principles" adopted by Council in 2010 should be continually adhered to, ensuring a structurally balanced budget
- The Mayor will update the City's Five-Year Financial Outlook in November 2019

# Highlights of the FY 2020 Principles (cont'd)

- In FY 2020 the City's performance dashboard, PerformSD, will display historical information and targets for performance measures, which may be evaluated for updates during the fiscal year
- The Mayor will address the City's deferred capital backlog by implementing funded projects and working with the Council to identify resources necessary to address remaining unfunded deferred capital and new infrastructure needs

#### **Request for Council Action**

- Budget & Government Efficiency recommended approval on July 17, 2019.
- We request that the Council review the draft FY 2020 Statement of Budgetary Principles and adopt the Statement with any desired modifications.
