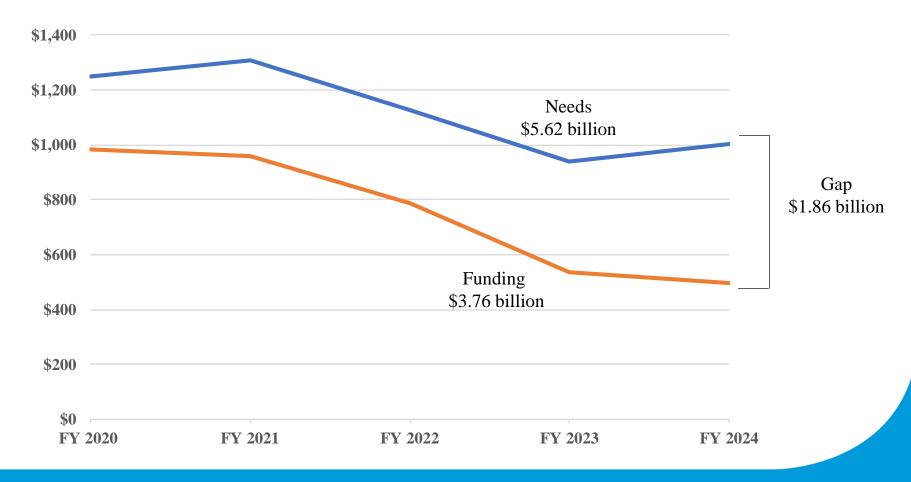


Purpose of CIP Outlook Multi-Year Capital Plan Required by City Charter

- Inform budget decisions
- CIP Outlook serves as the basis for the development of annual CIP budget

Overview of Mayor's Outlook Pure Water is the Key Driver of Outlook Trends

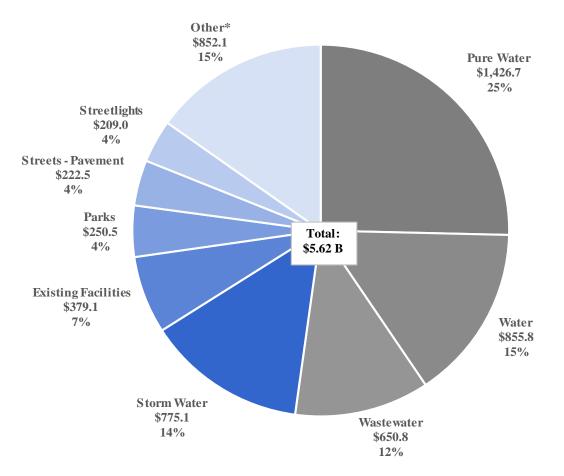
FY 2020-2024 Projected Needs and Available Funding

Projected Needs Capital Needs Increased by 28%

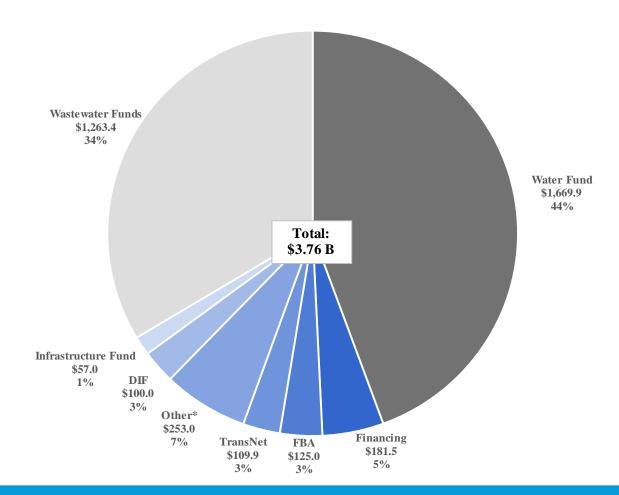
FY 2020 - 2024 Capital Needs by Asset (\$ in millions)

Projected Funding Gap Gap Increased by 18% But Mitigated by Funding Estimates

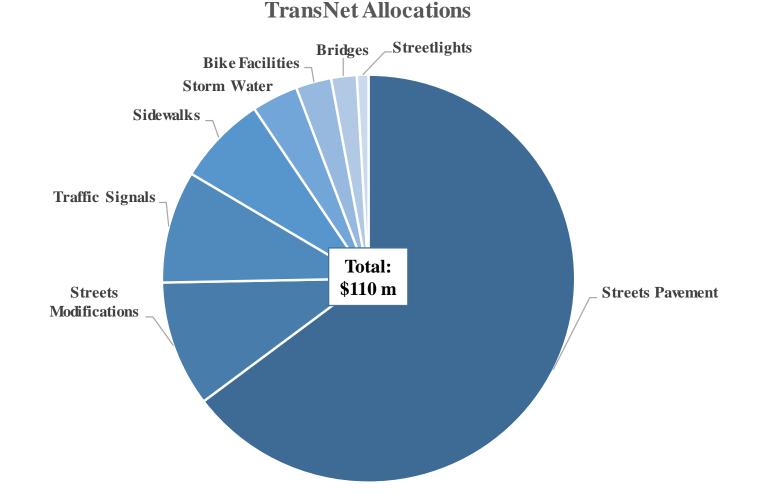

Opportunities for Community Input *Current Council Policy is Outdated*

- Council Policy 000-32 Neighborhood Input on Infrastructure Needs and Priorities is not reflective of current input practices
- Policy requires City to conduct input process annually, but current practice is every other year via survey
- Council may wish to review and update policy

Looking Forward

Assessing How the Outlook Fulfills its Purpose

- Adds significant value in presenting needs from a Citywide perspective
- Difficult to guide effective resource allocation
- City could benefit from prioritizing needs in future Outlooks by differentiating between critical and discretionary needs
- Asset management software could assist with prioritization

Conclusion

Recommendations for Council Consideration

- Request future Outlooks prioritize General Fund capital needs by differentiating between critical and discretionary needs
- Request future Outlooks include Council feedback provided through the online survey in the fall and make clear of this intent in Budget Development Key Dates
- Update Council policy on community input to reflect how communities can expect to engage in development of CIP budget
