When the Chair indicates it is your turn to speak, click the unmute prompt that will appear on your computer, tablet or Smartphone, or dial $* 6$ on your phone.

## WRITTEN COMMENT

Webform: Comment on Agenda items and Non-Agenda Public Comment may be submitted using the webform indicating the agenda item number for which you wish to submit your comment. Comments received by 11:00 AM the day of the meeting will be distributed to the Board of Library Commissioners and posted online with the meeting materials. All webform comments are limited to 200 words. Comments received after the deadlines described above but before the item is called will be submitted into written record for the relevant item. Materials submitted via U.S. Mail must be received the business day prior to the meeting to be distributed to the Board of Library Commissioners.
