1. <u>CALL TO ORDER</u>: Chair Leo Wilson called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. and proceeded with roll call.

2. <u>NON-AGENDA PUBLIC COMMENT</u>:

Joyce Summers updated CPC on CCDC activities.

Guy Preuss, Skyline/Paradise Hills, addressed a proposal for 600-square-foot lots discussed at the Code Monitoring Team.

Leo Wilson, Uptown, stated that CPC would be dark in August.

3. MODIFICATIONS AND APPROVAL OF AGENDA:

Jim Varnadore, City Heights, moved to approve the July 27, 2010 agenda. Motion passed unanimously.

4. <u>APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES OF JUNE 22, 2010</u>:

Jim Varnadore, City Heights, moved to approve the June 22, 2010 minutes. Motion passed unanimously.

5. <u>PROPOSED MODIFICATIONS TO THE CITY'S EMERGENCY</u> <u>REGULATIONS MAKING CERTAIN WATER USE RESTRICTIONS</u> PERMANENT: Action Item

City Councilmember Donna Frye and City Councilmember Marti Emerald gave a presentation on City's Emergency Regulations to make certain water use restrictions permanent.

Motion by Landry Watson, Ocean Beach, to approve the draft emergency water use restrictions as presented. Seconded by Ellen Willis, Rancho Bernardo. Motion passed by a vote of 24-2-1. 2 Against: Kensington-Talmadge and Navajo. 1 Abstention: Uptown.

6. <u>DISCUSSION WITH BILL ANDERSON, PLANNING DIRECTOR</u>: Bill Anderson, City Planning & Community Investment (CPCI) Director, gave an overview of CPCI's

projects and programs. CPC members asked questions and provided comments.

7. <u>PERMANENT HOMELESS FACILITY:</u> Action Item

Joyce Summers, spoke about the Permanent Homeless Facility downtown.

Motion by Landry Watson, Ocean Beach, to approve the Permanent Facility with centralized services associated with it. Seconded by David Moty, Kensington-Talmadge. Motion passed by a vote of 18-5-3. 5 Against: Eastern, City Heights, Skyline/Paradise Hills, Torrey Pines and University. 3 Abstentions: Mira Mesa, Clairemont and Uptown.

8. <u>PROPOSITION 'M' AMENDEMENT PROPOSAL</u>: Possible Action Item Scott Tillson, Carmel Valley Community Planning Board, made a presentation regarding the Prop 'M' amendment proposal.

Motion by Manjeet Ranu, Carmel Valley, to approve the Prop 'M' amendment proposal. Seconded by Dennis Ridz, Torrey Pines. Motion passed by a vote of 23-1-3. 1 Against: Skyline/Paradise Hills. 3 Abstentions: Pacific Beach, Rancho Bernardo, and Uptown.

9. ESTABLISHLING TIME LIMITATIONS ON CPC APPOINTMENTS: Action Item

Joe La Cava, La Jolla led a discussion on establishing time limitations for CPC committee appointments.

Motion by Joe La Cava, La Jolla, to approve terminating all current CPC appointments as of September 30, 2010; furthermore, appointments to represent the CPC on any board or committee can only be made by a vote of the CPC and such appointments will be valid for a period of not more than two years

Motion passed by a vote of 26-0-1. 1 Abstention: Uptown.
