#### SOURCES FOR POLICY MATRIX

- Inputs compiled from various sources:
  - Issues raised but not resolved in budget process
  - Councilmember requests in budget memos
  - Items requiring budget monitoring
  - Items from last year not yet completed
- Thirty-one recommendations focusing on public safety, restoring financial stability, and increasing efficiency and effectiveness
