

ZoomText: software designed for visually impaired people. The program allows you to see and hear everything on the computer screen as well as providing access to applications, documents, email and the Internet. The software can help individuals with early vision loss, computer vision syndrome, and visual impairments such as macular degeneration and glaucoma.

JAWS: a computer screen reader program that allows blind and visually impaired users to read the screen either with a text-to-speech output or by a refreshable Braille display. It features talking installation, two multi-lingual speech synthesizers, is fully compatible with MAGic screen magnification software and formatted basic





OPENBook and SARA software developed for blind and visually impaired individuals to read, edit, and manage scanned images from books, magazines, manuals, bills, newspapers, and other printed documents. It essentially turns your computer system into a scanning and reading machine.
