- Realigns some staffing in coordination with DSD


Department Refinements







Types of Updates

- Comprehensive: 36 months
 - Full range of update issues
 - Likely Environmental Impact Report
- Focused: 24-36 months
 - Targeted land use/mobility changes
 - Limited issue areas
 - Environmental document
- Clean-up: 18-24 months
 - Limited issue areas
 - No traffic studies
