A few implementations include amendments to Accessory Dwelling Units, affordable housing in all communities to meet the City's climate and equity goals and the facilitation of live work units among other implementations.
- 2. FY 23 Budget Priorities: Last week the City Council also heard the IBA's Fiscal Year 23 report on City Council Budget priorities. take a look but some projects included in District

8's priorities include requests for the full funding of \$25.5M of Southwest Park, \$2.9M in funding for the ADA improvement project at Robert Egger South Bay Recreation, and funding for improvements of Nestor Fire Station among other priorities.
