# **How-To Make Easy Party Decorations**

### **Instructions for 3 different party decorations:**

- Paper pinwheel/medallion
- Paper garland
- Paper pennant banner

# **Paper Pinwheel/Medallion**


#### Materials:

- Paper in colors of your choice
  - Note: The example uses 8.5"x11" but you can use other sizes depending on how big you want your decoration; all paper should be the same size
- Glue or tape
- Scissors (a circle cutter works great, if you have one on hand)
- 1. Take 3 sheets of paper and accordion fold each sheet






2. Fold each in half to create a fan shape and add glue to the middle section of the fan to keep it together





3. Glue all 3 fans together to create a medallion




4. Cut out a circle and glue it to the middle; you can also place a circle on the opposite side




# **Paper Garland**

## Materials:

- Paper in colors of your choice
- Glue or tape
- String
- Scissors (a circle cutter works great, if you have one on hand)
- Start by cutting out circles
   Note: Cut out as many needed for the length of garland desired



2. Glue or tape the circles on a length of string






#### Alternative methods:

- Choose a different shape instead of circles, such as hearts, flowers, leaves.
- Use a sewing machine to attach the shapes together highly recommended for quick and impressive results! Sewing machines are available to use at some <u>San</u> <u>Diego Public Library IDEA Labs</u>!

## Paper garland examples:








### **Paper Pennant Banner**


#### Materials:

- Paper in colors of your choice
- Glue or tape
- String
- Scissors
- Hole punch
- Decide what you want your banner to say. Count how many letters and spaces there are. Cut out pennant shapes equal to that number. Example: For a banner that will read "H2F", 3 pennant shapes will need to be cut out



2. Cut out letters needed for the banner 3. Glue each letter to a pennant

4. Punch two holes at the top of the pennant, one on each corner



5. String the pennant together



#### Alternative methods:

 Use a Silhouette Cameo cutting machine to cut out the pennant shapes and letters for a more polished look. This machine is available to use at the <u>San Diego Public</u> <u>Library IDEA Labs!</u>
