The Director of Public Works provided the following response:

“FYI, at the beginning of last summer all Community Planning Groups (CPG) were forward a similar survey that was later sent to the Council Offices. We worked with the Community Planners Committee (CPC) to get input from all Community Planning Groups (CPG) concerning their future long-term Capital Improvements needs. All requests received from the CPC/CPG were reviewed by staff and then organized by asset type (street, park, general facilities, water, sewer, and storm drain assets). Those requests were then sent to the appropriate asset managing department for their review and considerations to be included in their FY19 CIP Budget requests.

So to directly answer your question below, “yes” we are considering the submittal we received from the San Ysidro Community Planning Group. Please let me know if you would like a copy of what they submitted to us.”
