

CRB Information

The Citizens' Review Board on Police Practices is recruiting candidates for membership. The CRB was established in 1988 by Proposition G. The Board is responsible for reviewing serious citizen complaints against police officers, officer-involved shootings, and in-custody deaths.

The 23 members of the CRB reflect the diversity in San Diego. The Board strives for diversity in all of its definitions including ethnic, racial, geographic, occupation, gender, religion, and age. Prospective members will be interviewed by a committee of current Board members and others. Recommendations for membership are then sent to the Mayor for appointment. Board members may serve for up to eight, one-year terms. Board members must live in the City of San Diego.

The time commitment for the CRB is:

- second Tuesday of the month, 4:00 PM to 6:00 PM for a confidential case review meeting;
- fourth Tuesday of the month, 4:00 PM to 8:00 PM for a confidential case review meeting followed by an open public meeting;
- case review at Police Headquarters as a member of a three-person review team;
- participation on one of the standing committees; and
- training, ride-alongs, special meetings, conferences, etc.

The time commitment is approximately 10 to 20 hours per month.
