I am James McBride. I proudly am the product of a family who has served our city through building our infrastructure, cared for our terminally ill and advocate for our unrepresented children in our courts.

At 19 years old, living in District 2, I was an internationally published photographer several times. These photos were taken in Districts 1 and 2, which helped to strengthen tourism throughout the area. In the aftermath of 9-11, I volunteered for military service and was recruited by the Navy. I trained at North Island as a Search and Rescue swimmer. I was then deployed abroad.

During this time outside San Diego, I finished my Associates of Arts and Bachelor's of Science degrees. Subsequently, I was selected for an officercommissioning program and became an officer in the National Guard. I deployed to Iraq as an Apache Longbow pilot. In the National Guard, I completed an Executive MBA, then accepting a civilian position in management consulting.

I worked within national and international level policy. At the national level, my responsibility entailed delivering capabilities in the defense of critical infrastructure. While at the international level, my duties entailed enabling procurement of capabilities within the NATO alliance. I returned to San Diego, joined the California National Guard and partnered in starting a small business.

While a partner in small business, and participating in my National Guard duties, I significantly contributed to the development, growth and successful sale of this business. It remains successful today. In March 2013, the California National Guard selected me to become a test pilot. During the course of that training, I incurred a spinal injury that may end my military career, which is still to be decided. Rather than dwell on a situation that is out of my control, I have chosen to utilize the totality of my experience and education to benefit the issues that are important throughout our great city.

San Diegans in our Military Reserves are unemployed at nearly double the rate of their civilian counterparts. For the last year I have been consulting to a program that has been successful in California but underrepresented in San Diego. In February 2014, I briefed Speaker Elect Toni Atkins, with my work. The homelessness problem in San Diego, in my opinion, is a failure in creativity, and also in leadership. I cannot accept that a city with our abundance is unable to develop and execute, a reasonable solution. I have reached out to develop relationships with engineers and politicians and all are in agreement with the need to provide a solution. I have personally researched and found a federal program of funding from the Veterans Administration that is not being adequately utilized in San Diego County. I have also established a strategic relationship with an organization outside of California that has had nationally recognized success on homelessness. I have already given these to Council President Gloria's staff.

What can be done in 9 months? I wish to continue adding value to our city. Let's dream big, rally our community and lead change.

I have worked in public service my entire life. My first summer job at age 16 was with the New York Public Interest Research Group (NYPIRG), President Obama's first employer when he was a community organizer. I continued working for the organization until a senior in college, becoming an outreach director and running campaigns to protect the environment, consumers and public health.

For the final semester of my senior year at Cornell University in 2000, I was an intern in the office of Assemblyman Peter Rivera, and I was hired to remain on his staff. I handled constituent and lobbyist contact, drafted press releases, communicated with other assembly offices, and coordinated the Puerto Rican/Hispanic Task Force Conference.

While in law school, I used the skills I learned at NYPIRG to co-found the Animal Protection and Rescue League, a nonprofit advocacy organization now based in San Diego with a thrift store in Clairemont occupying nearly 5,000 square feet and employing 14 part-time employees, all paid a living wage.

I have been an elected board member since 2008 of the Ocean Beach People's Organic Food Market, a \$15 million per year grocery store and the largest employer in Ocean Beach. I am used to analyzing budgets and financial reports, dealing with the issues faced by businesses, and working with other board members with divergent views to arrive at a positive result. Mayor Faulconer issued a proclamation as a councilmember in 2012 to the Board including myself honoring the Co-op.

San Diego is well known for its technology, which city government needs to harness for solving some of our most pressing challenges such as water shortage and climate change. I have always been deeply interested in science. When my grandfather gave me his old Commodore 64 when I was 10, I was obsessed with writing programs for it, and even used a soldering iron to add new microchips for features such as stereo sound. Now the phone in my pocket is over a million times more powerful, and much too small to solder anything on, underscoring how technology changes exponentially. I was a science major at Cornell, and I continue to follow the latest scientific trends and policy solutions affecting the environment, public health and the economy.

As an attorney, I have enforced important city ordinances through writs of mandate, and I have also had one San Diego ordinance struck down by the Court as being unconstitutional (SDMC section 57.01.1 regarding soliciting charitable contributions.) I have also won lawsuits defending the free speech rights of San Diegans in Civic Center Plaza, Westgate Plaza and Fashion Valley Mall. My job has required me to work both with and against the City Attorney on various occasions, and I have dealt with many of the same deputy city attorneys for several years and have good relationships with them. As an interim councilmember, I can offer perspective from my legal training and experience to help the city avoid unnecessary litigation and craft the best legislation.

I have been privileged to live in San Diego nearly my entire life and fortunate to have a career protecting the public from both violent street crime and sophisticated consumer fraud. I have had the honor of representing San Diego, including almost all of Council District 2, in the State Legislature. <u>Academic</u>
