WEEKLY UPDATE MAY 16, 2006

As you know, the Council continues to review various City department budgets. We reviewed the City Attorney’s budget on Monday and for some reason, certain individuals were expecting the Council to act unprofessionally towards our City Attorney and his department’s budget proposal that was presented to us by the Mayor. I want all to know that I will treat with respect and professionalism all matters and individuals that come before the Council.

Regarding the City Attorney’s budget, I voiced concerns regarding the lack of budget resources dedicated to the Drug Abatement Response Team and the Neighborhood Prosecution Unit. Both programs are essential in addressing public safety issues that have negative impacts on communities, including gangs, prostitution, drug sales, smoke shops, transient crimes, problem bars, nightclubs, and properties. The successful injunction against Fam Mart, which I reported to you last week, is a result of the City Attorney’s Drug Abatement Response Team. I was pleased that the City Attorney listened to my concerns and agreed to look at expanding these two Units in this year’s budget.

My sincerest condolences and my prayers go out to the wife, child, and family of San Diego Police Officer David Moya. Officer Moya was killed in an unfortunate accident on May 12, 2006 while going home from work. He was truly one of America’s finest police officers and served the communities of the 4th District and the City of San Diego in an exemplary fashion. He will be greatly missed by his fellow officers of

the Southeastern Division and the entire San Diego Police Department. I hope and trust you will join me in praying for his family and fellow officers and thank Officer David Moya for a job well done.
