**Today, I will be adjourning the Council meeting in memory of 4<sup>th</sup>  
District City Councilman, Reverend George L. Stevens.**

Councilman Stevens passed away yesterday at the age of 74.

I send my sincerest condolences to his wife, Brenda; --his children Gary, Michelle, Marcus and Eric, and his grandchildren and family members. Everyone knows that George was an exceptional champion for improving the quality of life of the City and 4<sup>th</sup> District residents.

Seniors loved him and the George Stevens Senior Center is a shining example of that love.

Youth loved him and another shining example of that love is the Malcolm X Library and the many youth programs in our park and recreation centers.

Families loved him for his never-ending support of family values and the role of the church in the community

Business and government leaders loved him and admired him for his no nonsense approach to fighting for diversity and minority representation on programs, services, and contracts.

Yes, we all loved him for his commitment to public service as demonstrated by his service to his country as a member of the Army, Senior aide to a US Congressman and State Assembly member, and most important his invaluable service and contributions as an elected Councilman for City of San Diego's 4<sup>th</sup> District.

This may surprise some of you, but Councilman Stevens was also a team player.

A team player" is one who unites others toward a shared destiny through sharing information and ideas, empowering others and developing trust."

Reverend George L. Stevens united the community toward a shared destiny of reducing crime, improving the neighborhoods, and eliminating the stereotype of the 4th District being a group of neighborhoods less than any other neighborhoods and communities in the City.

George developed trust as so visibly evidenced by the residents expressing their trust in him by overwhelmingly voting him into office to serve two terms as San Diego City Councilman.

Reverend George L Stevens, 4<sup>th</sup> District Councilman will be greatly missed, will remain in our hearts forever, and is now in the arms of the Man he entrusted all his decisions in life to... he is in the arms of God.
