## **General suggestions:**

Review the overall tone, feels negative

Add state requirements for urban forestry programs

Feature the benefit/cost analyses more prominently, trees provide more benefits than costs over their lifetime

Calculate the additional economic values of 1000 trees, with the costs of planting and caring

Add a section on the administration and oversight of the urban forestry program (in addition to funding)

# **Suggestions for specific sections:**

For tree inventories, review historic images to assess changes over time

Work with Community Planning Groups to incorporate trees in Capital Improvement Projects submitted to the City

Contact Inland Empire regional urban forestry council, as they have assisted other cities with urban forest management plans

Contact San Diego Commission for Arts and Culture, to learn more about how they have applied for and implemented grants, <u>http://www.sandiego.gov/arts-culture/index.shtml</u>.

Incorporate suggested elements of tree ordinance proposed in about 2003, from Mike Singleton Get costs figures from the citywide tree care contract award

Address the additional expectations for tree trimming that the City has shifted to MADs Add paragraphs about trees' contributions to mitigating and adapting to climate change Add section on fees and non-compliance collections, and what funds are used for Incorporate rationale on water requirements of trees

9) **Public Comment:** Kevin Heiss from Talmadge had information on the Cape Chestnut heritage tree nomination, which will be on November's agenda.
