SAN DIEGO CITY CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION

FIRE FIGHTER I - 1461

DEFINITION:

Under immediate supervision, and in a training capacity, to perform increasingly responsible firefighting duties; and to perform related work.

CLASS CHARACTERISTICS:

Fire Fighters I are assigned to the training division in Fire Operations and receive extensive on-the-job training while learning the full range of firefighting operations.

* EXAMPLES OF DUTIES:

- Responds to fires and emergencies as a member of a fire company;
- Lays hose, carries and sets-up ladders, and uses fire equipment to extinguish fires and make rescues;
- Administers first aid;
- Participates in pre-fire and fire prevention inspections;
- Participates in drills and training activities;
- Cleans and maintains fire vehicles, apparatus, and equipment;
- Maintains fire station and grounds:
- Operates department non-emergency vehicles, and, when required, drives and operates fire vehicles, apparatus, equipment, and ambulances.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

Please note: the minimum qualifications stated below are a guide for determining the education, training, experience, special skills, and/or license which may be required for employment in the class. These are re-evaluated each time the position is opened for recruitment. Successful completion of the Basic Fire Academy authorized by the City of San Diego Fire–Rescue Department within six months prior to the date of application; **OR** current enrollment in the Basic Fire Academy authorized by the City of San Diego Fire–Rescue Department; **OR** one year of full–time experience as a Fire Fighter with the City of San Diego Fire–Rescue Department. Applicants will be required to pass the City of San Diego Fire–Rescue Department physical strength and agility evaluation at the time of hire. Possession of all the following valid certificates: Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) Certificate or a Paramedic License issued only by the State of California or by the National Registry (NREMT–Basic) or by an EMT or Paramedic certifying agency approved by the State of California; and Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) Card (Healthcare Provider/BLS Provider equivalent or higher). Possession of a valid California Class C Driver's License may be required.

* **EXAMPLES OF DUTIES** performed by employees in this class. The list may not include all required duties, nor are all listed tasks necessarily performed by everyone in this class.
