Carmel Valley Road Enhancements Project - Monthly Update**

Mitigation & Monitoring phase of the Carmel Valley Road Enhancement project will begin this week (week of November 10th). This project includes initial site remediation actions to bring the project into compliance with current project permit conditions and to perform monitoring and maintenance work for the **five year mitigation maintenance and monitoring period.**

HRS is the Contractor, and Dudek & Associates (Consultant) will assume the monitoring function. The scope of work includes:

- 1) Limited Grading of steep slopes that surround outlet pipes to a more suitable gradient that will support native vegetation.
- 2) Exotic vegetation removal, including 5 pepper trees that will be cut and removed.
- 3) Revegetation of the areas that are temporarily disturbed with native mix and container plants that are similar to the native vegetation present prior to disturbance.
- 4) Installation of a temporary irrigation system that will be used to promote native vegetation establishment.
- 5) Install installation of a Peeler log fence from the State Park entrance at McGonigle Road south 600 feet to the irrigation connection. The fence will protect the irrigation system and planted areas from pedestrian traffic that would damage these improvements. The fence will be a two rail fence, 42 inches tall with 6-inch diameter posts and 2+- inch diameter rails.

Follow up maintenance activities will be conducted twice a month through the end of the first year. This work is not anticipated to cause any inconvenience neither to residents nor to motorist. This information will be posted on the City's website to inform the general public.
