



## Miramar Landfill Acceptance Criteria for the Disposal of Contaminated Soil

The Miramar Landfill (Landfill) **does not accept** contaminated soil, classified as hazardous waste or designated waste. - The Landfill **may accept** non-hazardous contaminated soil generated within San Diego city limits and from other approved jurisdictions. However, operational restrictions or capacity limitations may limit the acceptance of contaminated soil. The Landfill accepts contaminated soil in accordance with the following requirements:

1. The generator must submit documentation to support the waste determination including a description of the sampling strategy and protocol followed, a copy of all laboratory analysis from a California certified laboratory, and a copy of the chain of custody. California Code of Regulations, Title 22, Division 4.5, Chapter 11, Article 3, Section 66261.20(c) specifies the sampling and analysis procedures that must be followed.
2. Soil contaminants may not exceed the maximum contaminant levels established by the San Diego Regional Water Quality Control Board in Addendum No. 1 to Order NO. 93-86, Maximum Concentration Limits for Soils Containing Nonhazardous Concentrations of Petroleum Hydrocarbons, Organic and Inorganic Compounds, Metals, and Pesticides for Municipal Solid Waste Landfills with Subtitle D Liners.
3. Soil contaminants must be less than the maximum contaminant levels established by the Landfill:

Contaminant	Maximum Concentration
Gasoline and lighter chain hydrocarbons (C <sub>4</sub> -C <sub>12</sub> )	100 mg/kg TPH
Diesel fuel and medium chain hydrocarbons (C <sub>8</sub> -C <sub>22</sub> )	1,000 mg/kg TPH
Waste oil and heavier chain hydrocarbons (C <sub>8</sub> -C <sub>40</sub> )	2,000 mg/kg TRPH
Lead	350 mg/kg TTLC
Polychlorinated biphenyls (PCBs)	Non-detect



The generator must submit a completed Special Waste Disposal Request signed by the generator or agent. All required documents shall be submitted to the Miramar Landfill's Hazardous Substances Enforcement Team a minimum of two (2) working days prior to the requested disposal date. The documents can be delivered to the Miramar Landfill (5180 Convoy Street, just north of State Route 52), or emailed to the contact listed on the Hazardous Substances Enforcement Team webpage at [www.sandiego.gov/environmental-services/ep/hazteam](http://www.sandiego.gov/environmental-services/ep/hazteam) or mailed to:

4. Approved waste is only accepted for disposal at the Landfill Monday through Friday, excluding designated holidays, between 7:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m.
5. An appointment for disposal is required. Appointments must be scheduled by 9:00 a.m. the day prior to disposal by calling the Hazardous Substances Enforcement Team at 858-573-1415. **There are no exceptions to this scheduling requirement.**

A completed Special Waste Manifest is required for each load and must accompany the load at the time of disposal.
