Mission Statement

To safeguard the public by vigorously bringing misdemeanor criminals to justice through serving the residents of San Diego as both its misdemeanor prosecutor and its chief legal advisor, and to serve as chief advisor by providing legal guidance to the Mayor, City Council, Council Committees, and City Departments.

Department Description

In 1931, San Diego voters adopted a new City Charter that included the creation of an independently elected City Attorney. The duty of the Office of the City Attorney is to protect the interests of all San Diegans.

The Office is divided into three divisions: Civil, Criminal, and Administrative. The primary operations of the Office are established in the San Diego City Charter and are carried out by the Criminal and Civil Divisions.

The Criminal Division prosecutes misdemeanor criminal offenders and provides proactive community-based public safety programs. Crimes prosecuted by the Office include violations of City, County, and State laws occurring within the City of San Diego and the City of Poway.

The Civil Division provides legal advice to every level of City government, files lawsuits on behalf of the City, and defends lawsuits brought against the City.

The Office of the City Attorney is staffed with professional, civic-minded public servants. Attorneys, investigators, secretaries, legal assistants, and support staff work to serve the people of the City of San Diego and the State of California.

The Office of the City Attorney has been recognized at the local, State, and national levels for innovation, excellence, and measurable results related to efficiency, effectiveness, and public safety.

Service Efforts and Accomplishments

Criminal Division:

The Consumer Fraud Unit has secured \$1 million in civil enforcement penalties and \$194,000 in victim restitution. The Code Enforcement Unit has recovered nearly \$300,000 in investigative costs, fines, and penalties. The Division has also been awarded nearly \$250,000 in grants. A total of 40,111 misdemeanor cases were reviewed which included 6,967 cases of suspended, revoked, or unlicensed drivers, 5,710 cases of driving under the influence, 3,500 domestic violence cases, and 143 child abuse cases. The Consumer Environmental and Protection Unit reviewed over 450 consumer complaints.

The Neighborhood Prosecution Unit now works in 25 neighborhoods with the addition of the Southeastern part of the City and San Ysidro in 2006. Prosecutors work with the Police Department, other agencies, and community members to combat quality of life crimes.

The San Diego Traffic Offender Program, (STOP), in partnership with the Police Department, seized 209 vehicles from repeat traffic offenders.

The Code Enforcement Unit prosecuted landlords and business owners for substandard housing violations, including lead hazards. The Unit recovered more than \$42,000 in relocation costs to assist tenants in moving to safe, decent housing, and donated \$9,000 to non-profit groups from creative sentencing terms imposed against defendants.

The Drug Abatement Response Team Unit, (DART), filed a major abatement case against the West Coast Crip Street Gang for criminal gang activity and Fam Mart for public nuisance activity dealing with illegal sales of counterfeit merchandise.

Civil Division:

In response to an appeal by the Office of the City Attorney, the California Fourth District Court of Appeal issued a unanimous decision to uphold the will of voters to donate the Mount Soledad War Memorial to the federal government by reversing a lower court's ruling. The appeal was filed in response to 76 percent of voters who supported Proposition A in July 2005. The Division has obtained \$7.5 million in settlements, judgments, and other recoveries by the Civil Division Plaintiffs' Litigation and Recovery process.

An appeal by the Office of the City Attorney resulted in a major victory for San Diego taxpayers when the California Supreme Court upheld a lower court's ruling overturning the majority of developer Roque de la Fuente's \$94.5 million verdict against the City of San Diego.

After a two year investigation by the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) into the City of San Diego's fraudulent municipal bond offerings, the Office of the City Attorney negotiated a settlement agreement with the SEC. The settlement did not impose fines on the City but required that an independent consultant be hired to monitor compliance.

The Public Finance, Securities and Disclosure Unit provided structuring and legal advice to various City departments relative to the issuance by the City and its related entities of approximately \$660 million of debt obligations.

The Litigation Unit handled approximately 300 civil lawsuits filed against the City in 2006. Most of those cases were or will be resolved either without any monetary payment by the City, or by the payment of a nominal sum.

The Civil Advisory Division attorneys drafted more than 100 pieces of new legislation, provided legal review on more than 900 individual matters requiring City Council action, and provided legal support on thousands of other matters.
