SUBJECT: Fiscal Year 2014 Proposed Budget Presentation Referral Response

This memorandum is in response to questions asked at the City Council Meeting held on April 16, 2013. The responses are listed by department in the order the questions were asked by the Council Members.

COUNCIL DISTRICT 3

QUESTION:

Provide a breakdown of the added on-going expenditures.

RESPONSE:

Attachment 1 provides the added on-going expenditures in the Fiscal Year 2014 Proposed budget.

QUESTION:

Are there any service level reductions or enhancements?

RESPONSE:

The Fiscal Year 2014 Proposed Budget provides modest service level enhancements for the General Fund. The enhancements focus primarily on neighborhood services, including neighborhood infrastructure, and public safety needs. These service enhancements are listed in more detail in the Executive Summary of Volume I on pages 38-41. There are no service-level reductions in the Fiscal Year 2014 Proposed Budget.

QUESTION:

Are there any planned efficiency savings in the Fiscal Year 2014 Proposed Budget?

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RESPONSE:

The Fiscal Year 2014 Proposed Budget includes savings from five managed competition functions:

- **Publishing Services:** The first competition was won by the Publishing Service Employee Proposal Team and was officially implemented on July 1, 2011. This competition has resulted in approximately \$1.0 million in annual savings starting in Fiscal Year 2012.
- **Fleet Maintenance:** Fleet Maintenance Operations was awarded to the Fleet Maintenance Employee Proposal Team with an implementation date originally scheduled for January 1, 2012. Due to the time required to carry out mandated processes such as meet and confer, procurement, reduction-in-force, and other necessary processes to implement the proposal, the revised estimated completion date is September 1, 2013. Initial annual savings were projected to be up to \$5.3 million beginning in Fiscal Year 2013. As a result of a negotiated agreement with the impacted labor organizations in July 2012, 12.50 FTE positions and \$1.3 million in expenditures have been added back to the Fleet Services Fiscal Year 2014 Proposed Budget resulting in an updated annual savings of \$4.0 million as it relates to the Employee Proposal Team's Alternate Proposal. The processes stated above remain on-going at the time of the Fiscal Year 2014 Proposed Budget publication and could impact the projected savings; if so, savings will be revised appropriately.
- **Street Sweeping:** The third competition was won by the Street Sweeping Employee Proposal Team. The implementation began December 1, 2012. The employees' proposal has already begun to result in cost savings for Fiscal Year 2013 and will continue to yield \$0.5 million in annual savings in subsequent years.
- **Landfill Operations:** Landfill Operations was awarded to the Landfill Operations Employee Proposal Team with an implementation date scheduled for July 1, 2013 pending the outcome of required processes such as the meet and confer obligations with the impacted labor organizations. Upon full implementation, the Employees' Proposal will result in \$3.5 million in annual savings planned to commence in Fiscal Year 2014. The \$3.5 million in savings is included in the Fiscal Year 2014 Proposed Budget in the Environmental Services Department.
- **Street & Sidewalk Maintenance:** The fifth competition was won by the Street & Sidewalk Maintenance Employee Proposal Team. The implementation will be in Fiscal Year 2014 pending the outcome of meet-and-confer and will result in \$0.8 million in annual savings. In Fiscal Year 2014, the savings are estimated at \$0.6 million. These savings are included in the Fiscal Year 2014 Proposed Budget in the Transportation & Storm Water Department.

In addition, the Fiscal Year 2014 Proposed Budget includes a reallocation of \$185,000 in funding to provide an enhanced level of service related to the BID Council. The Mayor is proposing to

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use a vacant Program Manager position in the Economic Development Division of the Development Services Department to create a “BID Advocate” position. It will be this person’s job to support the BID council directly in the work it already does and also draw on the BIDs expertise and experience to support and expand small businesses in our neighborhoods.

RESPONSE:

QUESTION:

Provide a list of any CIP projects that are proposed by council district. Are there any new appropriations in Fiscal Year 2014?

RESPONSE:

Attachment 4 provides a list of CIP projects by council district, including new appropriations for Fiscal Year 2014.

QUESTION:

Provide an explanation for any departmental restructurings. For example, what is the scope of the Civic and Urban Initiatives Program?

RESPONSE:

A description of all restructures that were incorporated into the Fiscal Year 2014 Proposed Budget is included on pages 34-35 of Volume I of the Fiscal Year 2014 Proposed Budget Document. Information regarding the Civic and Urban Initiatives Program is provided in a subsequent response.

QUESTION:

Provide a dissolution plan for San Diego Data Processing Corporation (SDDPC) and a plan for the remaining assets.

RESPONSE:

The SDDPC Board discussed a dissolution plan on May 2, 2013 and that plan was approved. It will be brought to the City Council for approval at the end of May. The City anticipates that the corporation will be dissolved before December 2013. The distribution of assets will occur after the corporation is dissolved once all legal and accounting issues are resolved, and any assets deposited with the City will be discussed in the Fiscal Year 2014 Mid-Year Report.

QUESTION:

Provide an update on City office space leases and costs.

RESPONSE:

The table below provides details on current office space leases that are expiring soon:

QUESTION:

Provide an update on state and federal lobbyist contracts.

RESPONSE:

The Mayor continues to interview firms and hopes to issue contract(s) before the end of the current fiscal year for state and federal lobbying services. Currently, the Mayor, along with his Chief of Staff, Director of Special Projects and Legal Affairs, and the Director of Council Relations has been in constant contact with the City's State and Federal delegation and members of the Brown and Obama administrations. The Mayor and his Executive team have also been working closely with the "Big Ten Mayors," the National League of Cities, and the League of California Cities to review and analyze pending legislation.

QUESTION:

Provide an update to the October 2012 Five-Year Financial Outlook.

RESPONSE:

The Mayor will be releasing a new Five-Year Financial Outlook in October/November 2013 which will reflect his priorities.

QUESTION:

Where will the Emergency Homeless Shelter be located on an ongoing basis, and are the costs for permitting the shelter included in the Proposed Budget? What about the Veterans' Tent?

RESPONSE:

The Mayor has convened a working group made up of multiple City departments and the Housing Commission to address the necessary steps to transition the City's Winter Homeless Shelter to a year-round operation. This includes evaluating the existing location and determining permitting and safety requirements.

The Fiscal Year 2013 budget includes \$250,000 to support the Veterans Homeless Emergency Winter Shelter. The Mayor is working with Veterans homeless service providers, the Veteran's Administration and his veteran advisory committee to develop a comprehensive plan to address homelessness among our veteran community.

QUESTION:

Provide more details on the proposal for the Business Improvement District (BID) Council in the Proposed Budget. Are there any service impacts?

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RESPONSE:

The Mayor is proposing to use a vacant Program Manager position in the Economic Development Division of the Development Services Department to create a “BID Advocate” position. It will be this person’s job to support the BID council directly in the work it already does and also draw on the BIDs expertise and experience to support and expand small businesses in our neighborhoods. A service level enhancement to the BIDs is anticipated with the filling of this position. This change will create greater City accountability to the BIDs.

QUESTION:

Provide more details on the neighborhood enhancements in the Proposed Budget, specifically the Civic and Urban Initiatives Program.

RESPONSE:

The Mayor will be presenting information on the Civic and Urban Initiatives Program to the Budget Review Committee during the budget hearing on May 7, 2013.

QUESTION:

Provide specific details on the request for additional funding for tree trimming. Who will provide this service? How will service be prioritized?

RESPONSE:

The additional \$500,000 for tree trimming in the Fiscal Year 2014 Proposed Budget is planned to be performed via contract. The specific vendor(s) that will provide the service will be determined through the City’s purchasing processes. The additional funding will allow the City to trim approximately 11,000 palm trees during Fiscal Year 2014. A City arborist will determine which palm tree locations have the greatest need based on soil condition, years of growth since last trimming, and overall health of the trees. The existing \$300,000 of on-going budget for tree maintenance contracts will be used to trim critical broadleaf trees, remove hazardous trees, prune roots, and grind stumps.

QUESTION:

Provide information on the Balboa Park traffic management plan and why this amount has decreased from what was originally proposed at the City Council at the mid-year monitoring report.

RESPONSE:

The Balboa Park Traffic Management Plan will be implemented over the following phases:

- **Phase I**
 - o Close the Laurel Street Bridge weekends/holidays. The intent is to implement this effective Saturday, May 25, 2013 and continue through future weekends and

holidays. Based upon the schedule provided by CalTrans, the Laurel Street Bridge is to be closed from at least January 2014 to May 2014.

- o During this phase, approximately 25 accessible parking spaces will be added in the Organ Pavilion Parking Lot.
- **Phase II**
 - o Eliminate parking from the Plaza de Panama with cars moving through the southwest quadrant. The current plan is to have the parking removed from the Plaza de Panama by late June/early July 2013.
- **Phase III**
 - o Expand accessible parking in the Alcazar Garden Parking Lot as per the Central Mesa Precise Plan and evaluate the potential of changing some of the non-accessible parking spaces to “timed/limited” parking. Park and Recreation staff is working with Public Works staff to determine the most cost-effective manner in creating additional accessible parking spaces.

The initial funding to implement this plan was estimated to be \$500,000, but after further analysis and refinements, Park and Recreation staff has reduced the estimate to \$300,000.

It should be noted that these temporary parking and transportation plans have been vetted on numerous occasions. Since these changes do not involve capital improvements to implement and are operational at this time, Park and Recreation Staff does not envision the need to hire any consultants which would require a formal RFP process.

QUESTION:

What is the total cost of funding the Metropolitan Transit System (MTS) Bus Passes from the City, School District, and the MTS board?

RESPONSE:

This one-year pilot program is proposed to be funded by the San Diego Unified School District for \$150,000 and the City of San Diego for \$200,000, which is included in the Fiscal Year 2014 Proposed Budget. This program is designed to determine if providing bus passes to needy students will improve their school attendance. It is targeted at 1,000 high school students at Lincoln, San Diego, Crawford and Hoover High Schools, which are schools that have never been served by a school bus transportation program. The bus passes will be provided to the high school principals who will select the students that will benefit the most from this program based on their financial need or other criteria established by the school district. This program has an evaluation component to determine its performance. If the program is successful in demonstrating that student attendance has improved, the school districts will continue to fund the program.

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COUNCIL DISTRICT 7

QUESTION:

The total change in department expenditures from Fiscal Year 2013 to Fiscal Year 2014 for the Fire-Rescue Department is \$14.5 million; the total change in department expenditures for Police is \$2.6 million. In summary, \$11.9 million more will be spent on Fire than Police in FY 2014. Is that accurate?

RESPONSE:

The variance in the net expenditure increases in the Fire-Rescue Department versus the Police Department is primarily attributable to both the increase and allocation of the Retirement Annual Required Contribution (ARC), which is \$275.4 million per the SDCERS Actuarial Valuation as of June 30, 2012.

Proposition B closed the plan for General Members and for Fire and Lifeguard Safety Members. However, the plan remains open for Police Safety Members. The Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB) rules require the Unfunded Actuarial Accrued Liability (UAAL) associated with the closed General and Fire/Lifeguard Safety plans to be paid off more quickly. A level dollar amortization was applied to the closed plan portion of the UAAL to follow present GASB standards. That portion of the UAAL associated with the open Police plan will continue to be amortized as a level percentage of pay. The plan closure for non-Police Members and the change in the amortization method resulted in an increase in the City's ARC of approximately \$27.0 million, of which the General Fund portion is approximately \$20.8 million. Consequently, the Fire Department's Retirement ARC allocation increased by a higher percentage than the Police Department's allocation due to the Police Safety plan continuing to be an open system. The FY 2014 ARC rates (used in the budget to allocate the City's total ARC of \$275.4 million by plan member) for Fire Safety Members increased by almost 43%, compared to Police Safety Members which increased by less than 11% over the FY 2013 ARC rates.

This is the main factor for the \$13.9 million dollar increase in the Retirement ARC budget in the General Fund for the Fire Department compared to an increase of only \$5.5 million in the Police Department.

Fiscal Year 2014 Proposed Budget Added On-Going Expenditures

GENERAL FUND:

ADMINISTRATION

- o Addition of \$7,950 in expenditures and offsetting revenue (\$7,201) for increase in EMS Medical Director Contract.

CITY CLERK

- o Addition of 1.00 Information Systems Analyst III (\$131,485), offset by reduction of 1.00 Clerical Assistant II (\$61,032), to support daily information technology operations and various paperless initiatives.

CITY TREASURER

- o Increase of \$390,000 in expenditures and associated pass-through revenue related to additional revenue from the installation of 81 multi-space meters.
- o Addition of \$87,000 in expenditures and \$100,000 in associated revenue for 1,000 single-head parking meters and 200 parking meter sensors.

CITYWIDE PROGRAM EXPENDITURES

- o Increase of \$2.6M in expenditure transfer to the improvement funds based on projected Mission Bay rent and concession revenue per the Mission Bay Ordinance.
- o Addition of \$2.0M in debt service expenditures related to additional \$35M Capital Improvement Projects Bond Issuance.
- o Addition of \$1.4M in expenditures for the allocation of the pay-go costs for the continued funding of the Supplemental Cost of Living Adjustment (COLA) benefit.

- o Decrease of \$502,700 in vacancy savings to bring the personnel expenditures budget in line with historic actuals.
- o Addition of \$442,897 (12.00 FTEs) for hourly seasonal lifeguards.
- o Addition of 2.00 Fire Dispatchers (\$161,194), 1.00 Information Systems Analyst II (\$96,720) and associated revenue (\$272,793) to handle increased call volume and radio traffic from the newly acquired dispatch contracts with the City of National City.

HUMAN RESOURCES

- o Addition of \$10,500 for energy and utility costs.

INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

- o Addition of 1.00 Multimedia Coordinator (\$90,330) to meet expanding video production needs and support for daily operations of CityTV.

 - Addition of 4.50 FTE positions (\$455,782), and \$2.0M in non-personnel expenditures to support the New Central Library. *(These expenditures are offset by donation revenue from the San Diego Public Library Foundation and reimbursement revenue from the San Diego City School District.)*
- o Addition of \$225,000 in expenditures to replace public use computers at branch libraries.

- o Addition of 1.00 Library Aide (\$84,448), offset by a decrease of non-standard hour positions (\$79,395).

OFFICE OF THE ASSISTANT COO

- o Addition of 1.00 Assistant to the Director position
- o Reduction of 1.00 Executive Secretary transferred from the Business Office

OFFICE OF THE CHIEF FINANCIAL OFFICER

- o Addition of 0.25 Associate Management Analyst (\$21,392) offset by decrease in non-personnel expenditures (\$21,392).

OFFICE OF THE MAYOR

- o Addition of 1.00 Mayor Representative 2 (\$104,980) to lead the City's effort for increased government transparency.
- o Addition of 1.00 Mayor Representative 2 (\$65,132) Community Affairs Representative.

PARK & RECREATION

- o Addition of 4.00 Park Rangers (\$311,983) and 1.00 Pesticide Applicator (\$74,660) and associated non-personnel expenditures (\$101,000) to support maintenance and operations of the new West Sycamore acreage in Mission Trails Regional Park.
- o Addition of 1.00 limited Program Manager (\$192,015), 1.00 limited District Manager (\$111,498), and 1.00 limited Clerical Assistant 2 (\$61,032) and associated non-personnel expenditures of \$21,000 to support the Balboa Park Centennial Celebration 2015.
- o Addition of 1.00 Principal Drafting Aide (\$95,760), 1.00 Park Ranger (\$77,996), and non-personnel expenditures (\$23,000) with reimbursable revenue (\$49,700) from Maintenance Assessment Districts to support the maintenance and operations of new open space acreage.

- o Addition of 0.22 Grounds Maintenance Worker – Hourly (\$6,974) to reinstate restroom service in the winter months for restrooms located at South Kellogg and North Mission Beach.
- o Addition of 0.04 hourly Grounds Maintenance Worker 2 – Hourly (\$1,404) and associated non-personnel expenses (\$1,200) to support the maintenance and operations of the West Maple Canyon Mini-Park.

PERSONNEL

- o Addition of 1.00 Associate Personnel Analyst (\$103,095) and associated non-personnel expenditures (\$1,000) to assist with safety examination process.
- o Addition of 0.50 Test Monitor II (\$28,192) to assist with technology changes associated with the NEOGOV online application system.
- o Addition of \$25,000 to support the New Employee Medical Examination & Random Drug Testing Program.

POLICE

- o Addition of 16.00 Police Officer II (8.67 FTE) positions (\$1.1M) and associated non-personnel expenditures (\$108,500) to support an increase of Police Academy recruits from 30 to 34 for each of the four academies held throughout Fiscal Year 2014 as part of the five-year staffing plan.

PUBLIC WORKS - CONTRACTING

- o Addition of 1.00 Administrative Aide 2 (\$80,640) and 1.00 Clerical Assistant 2 (\$61,032) and offsetting revenue (\$141,672) for administrative and budget support.

PUBLIC WORKS – ENGINEERING & CAPITAL PROJECTS

- o Addition of 1.00 Senior Civil Engineer (\$134,202), 1.00 Associate Civil Engineer (\$118,204), 1.00 Assistant Civil Engineer (\$104,430), and 1.00 Principal Engineering Aide (\$92,063) and offsetting revenue (\$590,784) to support Field Engineering Division in maintaining storm water compliance on all construction projects.

PUBLIC WORKS – GENERAL SERVICES / FACILITIES DIVISION

- o Addition of 9.00 FTE positions (\$720,909) and associated non-personnel expenditures (\$151,639) to provide operations and maintenance support for the deferred capital backlog.
- o Decrease of \$325,062 in vacancy savings that will allow the department to hire an additional 8.00 FTE positions that are currently held vacant to work on Facilities related projects.

PURCHASING & CONTRACTING

- o Addition of 1.00 Supervising Management Analyst (\$123,553) and transfer of 1.00 Associate Management Analyst (\$94,399) from the Business Office to support the Equal Opportunity Contracting (EOC) Program.

TRANSPORATION & STORM WATER

- o Addition of \$2.3M for operations and maintenance support related to street resurfacing and storm drain related capital requirements.
- o Addition of 1.00 Senior Civil Engineer (\$134,202) and 1.00 Associate Planner (\$102,631) with associated non-personnel expenditures (\$2.0M) for compliance with the bacteria total maximum daily load (TMDL) and the municipal storm water permit requirements.
- o Addition of \$500,000 in expenditures for palm tree and shade tree trimming contracts.
- o Addition of 1.00 Program Manager (\$120,744) to oversee the citywide Bicycle Program.

WATER

- o Addition of \$254,100 in funding for the San Dieguito River Park Joint Powers Authority (JPA).

NON-GENERAL FUNDS

FLEET SERVICES OPERATING FUND (Public Works – General Services)

- o Restoration of 12.50 FTE positions (\$1.0 million) and associated non-personnel expenditures (\$267,321) associated with the Fleet Services Managed Competition Employee Proposal Team's Alternate Proposal related to automobile parts supplying, and adjustment to expenditures to reflect the approved Fiscal Year 2014 Bid level.
- o Addition of \$1.2M in expenditures associated with the implementation of the new citywide Global Positioning System (GPS) Contract.
- o Addition of \$449,445 for purchase of new tires for the City's fleet vehicles due to the rising cost of new tires.

- o Addition of \$300,000 in expenditures for public space recycling projects and \$200,000 in expenditures for recycling education and outreach programs.
- o Addition of \$19,732 to reflect the allocation of the pay-go costs for the continued funding of the Supplemental COLA Benefit.
