FACILITY DESCRIPTION

The recreation center has a full court gymnasium, meeting room, activity room, craft room, and kitchen. The community park features a lighted outdoor basketball court, two tot lots, picnic areas with barbecue grills and walkways throughout the park. In addition, the lower portion of the park has decomposed granite, quarter mile trail; complete with par course around the perimeter of the trail for the fitness enthusiast.
