

Planning Commissioner Comments on Staff Presentation:

Wagner:

- Need to maintain economic relevance and profitability of Mission Valley.
- How do we compliment the natural environment with other concerns?
 - The community plan update provides the baseline to follow (might not be economically relevant)
- The Facilities Financing Plan is not subservient to the Community Plan
 - The Planning Commission does not have the opportunity to review the plan or discuss how to bolster economic principles
 - \circ $\;$ Want to know what will be paid for by the projected increase in density
 - Want understand how the DIF will change
 - Would like opportunity to address these issues before the final draft of the plan
 - Would like to see a presentation by the facilities financing team
- San Diego River trail system should count as a park credit for developments
 - This is included in the San Diego River Park Master Plan, but it also needs to be memorialized in the Community Plan

Peerson:

- Support the idea of a 'development vision vs. development restrictions'
- Should emphasize design framework and urban form to create experiences
- The Map Atlas is a good reference but would like to see overlays to determine land use suitability
 - Look beyond boundaries of community
 - Look at topography (canyons, river, etc)
- Need to look at the valley as an environmental system
 - The plan needs to focus on hydrology, storm water management, water, etc.
- Design Concerns
 - Want to see contiguous walkways between individual developments
- Would like to hear about the recommendations that come out of the I-8 Corridor study
- Support phasing plan for infrastructure
- Explore Transfer of Development Rights (TDR) opportunities in valley
 - Ex. River corridor could be sending sites (set aside for wetland restoration, parks, etc.)
 - Not a fan of CPIOZ
- Found Spaces



Mission Valley Community Plan Update Planning Commission Workshop September 24, 2015

- Need to look at non-traditional park spaces (under the I-805)
- o Define what does public space mean
- Future of Large Sites
 - Should consider shared parking opportunities
 - Need to look at water runoff from large parking lots, roofs, etc.
- South of I-8
 - Potentially a receiver area for car- dealerships
- Future Trolley
 - Will link 3 major higher learning institutions in San Diego (UCSD, USD, SDSU)
 - o Mission Valley could be central hub for student housing
- Need to establish Urban Design Framework
 - Identify existing density in community
 - Need to understand what DU/Acre means on ground
 - o Mission Valley needs to remain a hub for employment
 - Develop an Urban Form Figure Ground Map
 - 3d visual will help inform process
 - Promote density
- Would like an additional Planning Commission Workshop to discuss the Alternatives, prior to the release of the Draft document.

<u>Quiroz</u>:

- The plan needs to look 30 years into the future.
 - Don't ask what people want to see now, need to be forward/future looking
- Continuity is essential
 - Mission Valley is isolated from surrounding areas (Linda Vista, Serra Mesa, Old Town)
 - Especially area south of I-8
- Flooding
 - Need to look at areas between developments to see how they impact flooding
 - Ex. Roads, paths, etc.
- Pedestrian Accessibility
 - Need to fix barriers to pedestrian movement
 - Ex. At Fashion Valley mall the bus stop was moved to the back of the mall and is hidden - need to reverse this.
- Walkways
 - o There is a lack of 'eyes on the street' which creates safety issues



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- o Need to have apartments overlooking pathways
- Lack of North- South connections
 - Makes it difficult for pedestrians to navigate valley
 - Need to connect tourists staying in Hotel Circle to malls and to Old Town
 - Open up bike connection between Hotel Circle and Old Town along Taylor Street
- Public Facilities
 - Backlog of public facilities needs to be completed
 - No schools, Fire Department not open, need police station
 - \circ Need to set aside space for public services that are currently missing in plan
- Loss of Vision
 - The vision for Mission Valley has been lost due to excessive community plan amendments
 - Need statement in plan that 'no more amendments' will be granted
- Continuity
 - Need to restore neighborhood and community feeling in Valley
 - Remember what makes Mission Valley special
 - Riverbed River needs to be #1 consideration
 - Dairy farms
- Infrastructure Finance District
 - Do not like the idea of further pushing developers to pay more

<u>Austin</u>:

- Like establishing vision vs. establishing rules
- Want projects to be future looking 'skating to the puck'
- Emphasize connectivity
- Like that you are looking at current issues as well (Path of Discovery activity)
- Focusing on Trip Generation is in the past
- Need to embrace density
- Look for innovative transportation modes
 - Look at international examples

<u>Haase</u>:

- Need to honor that Mission Valley is s sub-regional center
- Need to create neighborhoods from the different districts
 - \circ $\;$ Look to downtown San Diego as an example of how that can be done



- Schedule
 - Would like to see the Public Facilities Financing Plan in Phase 4 or 5
 - Please have another Planning Commission Workshop prior to Draft document release
- Market Analysis
 - Would like to see a market analysis conducted once alternatives are developed
 - Need to see how different uses contribute to city (city chasing sales tax)
- Previous plan required amendments to develop Specific Plans
 - o Used to create different neighborhoods, but these were not well connected
- South of I-8
 - Don't try to do something we can't do
 - Don't propose infeasible connections (ex. Tunnel under I-8)
 - Need to create value there without connections
 - Consider creating a linear community
- Focus on Water
 - o River is a not a true river, is a flood control channel
 - Need to be able to adapt to flooding events
 - Address sea level rise
 - 200 and 500 year flooding events
- Community Plan Boundaries
 - Consider boundary adjustments
 - Area adjacent to north east corner of Mission Valley is included in Tierrasanta community, yet this area has no road connection to Tierrasanta

<u>Golba</u>:

- There is an opportunity to be visionary in Mission Valley
- How do we handle the stadium site?
 - Don't want to have to update new plan based on future stadium
 - Need to make sure you look at different options as the update moved forward and there is more information available on the site
- Interconnectivity with the River needs to be improved
 - People never see the river
 - Need to fully embrace the river with public spaces and parks

- New School of Architecture Students with Support from professional staff
- Ideas could possibly be used as part of Community Plan Update process
- 1 yearlong project
- No community outreach
- Relied on previously produced plans, projects and articles about the Valley.
- Conducted a SWOT analysis
- Issues identified:
 - o River is lost
 - No North-South Connections
 - Pedestrians encounter barriers (crossing streets, between developments)
 - The trolley is difficult to access
 - Dying shopping centers
 - Low density development

Is there an enabling or catalyst project that will transform the valley?

What would be the type of infrastructure necessary to change the valley? For example: Tillicum Bridge in Portland is an innovative pedestrian, bike and transit only bridge.
