MOTIONS/CONSENSUS COMMENTS

Motions that were passed by the subcommittee, along with comments that expressed a consensus of the subcommittee, are listed below. Many of the motions received split votes.

#### Overall:

This element covers topics that should not be the role of government. The element should not expand beyond the traditional land use focus.

#### A. Industrial Land Use

- Goal Amend the first goal to state: "A city with a diversified economy with a focus on encouraging employment development that provides a full range of employment opportunity," rather than: "A city with a diversified economy with a focus on encouraging industrial development that provides middle-income employment opportunities."
- EP-A.3 Add "if it is in an area where it could satisfy existing or projected industrial sector needs and will be serviced by necessary facilities."

- EP-A.9. Amend language to say community plans <u>may</u> identify, not should.
- EP-A.2 Change to <u>industry's</u> ability.

#### B. Commercial Land Use

- Discussion Commercial Land Use Designations Table- put in a ratio of residential to visitor commercial use in that category.
- Goal Delete Goal #3 "New commercial development that does not impede the economic viability of existing commercial areas."

- EP-B.2 Delete the second half which states: "...strongly discourage the creation of new auto-oriented strip developments where parking is located between the street frontage and the buildings."
- EP-B.9 Delete the entire policy which states: "Encourage more intense commercial development in neighborhood and urban villages, transit corridors, and subregional employment centers where transit is available"
- EP-B.12 Amend the policy to state: "... should retain existing <u>viable</u> neighborhood commercial."

### C. Regional and Subregional Employment Districts

Discussion Note that a portion of Grantville is in Tierrasanta.

EP-C.9 Delete the entire policy which states: "In areas where encroachment of non-residential uses has already occurred, encourage the collocation of multi-family housing with office and retail commercial uses."

### **D. Employment Development**

Section D Delete the entire section.

#### E. Education and Workforce Development

EP-E.5 Delete the entire policy which reads: "Encourage city departments and other organizations to provide internships for students of all levels."

#### F. Business Development

- EP-F.5 Delete the entire policy which reads: "Evaluate the creation of nonbank community development corporations to assist with business growth in urbanized areas."
- EP-F.7 Amend the policy to replace the word "first" priority with "a priority."
- EP-F.9 Delete the reference to "firms involved in international trade."

#### G. Military Installations

- Goal Add the following goal: "A city that treats military families as a valued part of the greater community."
- EP-G.2 Update the BRAC language to specify "any future rounds of BRAC."

#### H. Economic Information and Monitoring

EP-H.1 Delete text which requires a community and economic benefit assessment "...for large retail establishments over 100,000 sq. ft. in size."

#### I. Redevelopment

EP-I.8 Revise the language to replace the word "ensure" with "<u>encourage</u>" the even geographic distribution of affordable housing in redevelopment project areas.

#### J. International Trade and Border Relations

ADD EP-J-9 "Support efforts to keep the borders open for commerce 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, and 365 days a year."
