Then you'll try your hand at putting the framework into practice in a project-based mock planning and strategy session.

#### **ORGANIZATION:**

District-scale sustainability comes in many shapes and sizes. So, what are a project's boundaries? Who are its stakeholders, and how do they interact with each other? We'll walk you through the critical questions and explore the community engagement each project needs.

#### ASSESSMENT:

What project priorities make the most sense for a district? We'll discuss the elements of an intensive neighborhood assessment and show how it can create neighborhooddriven, appropriate change. Learn about the EcoDistricts Priorities' distinct set of visions, goals and targets that unites sustainable neighborhoods across diverse communities.

#### ACTION:

Public-private-civic partnerships are essential. Find out what's behind the alignment and coordination of district stakeholders, private developers, public agencies and utilities to move a project idea to a reality.

#### **STEWARDSHIP:**

Find out how the Priorities can shape data collection for effective long-term stakeholder-driven management and ongoing improvement.
