#### Information Items

- 1. International Walk-to-School Day is October 7. Activities are scheduled at several local elementary schools.\
- 2. City of San Diego has launched a public information campaign, "Lose the Roaditude!" encouraging bicyclists, motorists and pedestrians to increase their awareness of common rules and to help cub aggressive on-road behaviors. "We consider people's willingness to ignore the rules of the road and act aggressive or negligent as "Roaditude."
- 3. NHCPG provided an information table at the Street Fair September 26<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup>. Special thank you to Nancy Wolfing for organizing the effort and to Rosanna Harrison for developing the flyers. We/I received \$13 in donations from button distribution to add to the \$24 previously collected. (We have no Treasurer.)
- 4. There will be a public forum October 27<sup>th</sup> to prepare for the Environmental Impact Review scoping meeting on November 17<sup>th</sup> regarding the proposed Bus Rapid Transit connections along SR-15 through Mid City. Four options for connections will be considered. Your concerns will be being solicited.
- 5. Planning group members are invited to attend this informal training session to learn how the City identifies and protects our historical resources. The review process for determining when a historical resource is present and the regulatory framework for designated historical resources will be discussed. The use of historic surveys in the community plan update process and historic preservation incentives, particularly the Mills Act tax reduction, will be presented, as well. There will be plenty of time for questions

and answers at the end of the session. If desired, a more advanced training session on specific historic resource issues may be provided at a future date.
