- Addition of new members as eligible NHCPG general members as appropriate, and nomination, election, and potential acceptance of additional Board member(s)- filling vacated terms and/or expanding membership to the official "normal" 15 members (minimum 12). Candidates are encouraged to contact Chair Jim Baross (619-280-6908) before the meeting to affirm interest.
- 2. Shall the NHCPG support (1) the dedication of <u>specific sites in the Normal Heights</u> <u>community planning area</u> from Open Space to Dedicated Park Space (2) support of the concept of dedicating ~10,000 acres of City-owned open space City-wide? The proposal is from Canyon Enhancement Planning Committee, Executive Director Eric Bowlby and Senior Landscape Architect Dick Rol. The San Diego Canyonlands organization's effort is to dedicate as parkland approximately 10,000 acres of City-owned open space to preserve as open space parkland as the city grows into the future. Over the next several months, they are meeting with over forty (40) planning groups to gain input and support of sites proposed for dedication in their planning areas."
- 3. Shall the NHCPG decide to support Urban Agriculture changes in Regulatory and General Plan Amendments to allow and/or modify restrictions on raising chickens, goats and bees; and the sales of produce?
- Discussion of ideas for uses and procedures for authorized expenditures for funds (approximately \$700) earned thanks to the Adams Ave. Business Association (AABA) and volunteer staffing for two T-Shirt/Information booths at the Street Fair organized by Suzanne Ledeboer.
- 5. Project Review
 - a. Project for Review and Decision:
 - i. 3296 El Cajon Blvd. Applicant cannot meet all the requirements of the landscape regulations due to the small nature of the site and existing conditions. Staff is now requiring a Variance in addition to the CUP. They are only deficit in the following areas: They have provided 3 street trees where 4 are required along 33rd Street. They have provided 3 street trees where 4 are required along El Cajon Blvd. The planting area requires 1,615 square feet and they are providing 1,050 square feet. The plant point requires 323 points and the applicant is proposing 236 points.

 - iii. 4490 Cherokee Avenue PROJECT SCOPE: Combination Building Permit to demo previous addition in rear and remodel existing single-dwelling unit. 11/8.
