- 2. The Mid-City BRT Planning Study Working Group Meeting was held June 27th at which the land use, mobility and implementation components of the Mid-City SR-15 BRT Station Area Planning Study were presented. Michael Prinz may be available to comment.
- 3. Utility Undergrounding community input issue and Utility Company Workshop was presented at the Community Planners Committee (CPC). Attending for the NHCPG were Jim Baross, Mark Rowland and Earlene Thom - issue to be heard again at CPC August 28th
- 4. Chair Baross reports from CPC June meeting: Council Policy and Land Development Manual updates to Council in July, Land Development Code amendment thresholds, Reorganization of CCDC and SEDC into "Civic San Diego", Discussion regarding potential CPC sponsored

Mayoral candidate forum, training for CPC members re: "What to know about reviewing projects".

Action Items – taken in a sequence to be decided during the meeting

- Addition of new NH Community members as eligible for voting as appropriate. Interested eligible community members are encouraged to contact Chair Jim Baross (619-280-6908) and/or to fill out and submit the membership application on our website at <u>http://www.adamsavenuebusiness.com/NHCPG.html</u>. Qualification as a Normal Heights eligible community member requires a person to be at least 18 years of age, and to be affiliated with the community as a (1) property owner, (2) resident, or (3) local businessperson – owner, operator of designee at a non-residential real property address in the community's planning area. The NHCPG area is bounded by El Cajon Blvd., Highway 805, Highway 15, and the slopes above Highway 8.
- Officially designating a backup representative to the CPC. Chair Baross is the current representative. He recommends that the Vice Chair, Mark Rowland be appointed to be the alternative/backup representative. A motion and vote of the Board is required, and submittal of CPC representative authorization form for an official appointment.
- 3. Ideas solicited for locating Bike Corrals: AABA is part of the Bike Friendly Business District program being administered through the BIDC and Bicycle Coalition. AABA is exploring areas to place bike corrals with recommendation/approval of the NHCPG. Due to fire lane access needs permanent corrals could not be put anywhere on Adams between 32nd and 35th because of the Street Fair
- 6. Discussion of processes appropriate for scheduling potential speakers/presenters for future NHCPG meetings, such as Co. Treasurer, City Auditor, etc. Current practice is for the Chair to schedule based on requests from potential presenters and interests of Board members. Perhaps refer this to an ad hoc committee to develop ideas and gage interest for a change in the current process, if desired?
- 4. Chair Baross, in absentia recommends that the NHCPG consider using its funds to organize and put on a Community Group Leaders and Friends social event – dinner, picnic, or ? – for meeting and greeting, and hearing from each other what is and/or should be happening in the community. If successful this might be an annual event funded by – hopefully – successful t-shirt sales. Will the NHCPG allocate funds? Who will work to organize?
