LOCATION #1: Fifth Avenue north of Pizza Nova and Washington Street between Fourth and Fifth avenues

- Hillcrest is highly walkable and this has important health benefits for walkers. Thus walkers (not cars) should be protected. There should be crosswalks at every intersection. If walkers are protected people will drive less, encouraging walking and making Hillcrest less noisy and polluted.
