WHEREAS, the Historical Resources Board for the City of San Diego held a noticed public hearing on January 25, 2001, to consider the historical site designation of the ARMED SERVICES YMCA, (owned by James V. Barone, 600 W. Broadway, San Diego, CA 92101), located at 500 West Broadway, (APN: 533-486-04, further described as Blk B, in the City of San Diego, County of San Diego, State of California); and

WHEREAS, in arriving at their decision, the Historical Resources Board considered the historical/architectural report prepared by the applicant, the staff report and recommendation, all other materials submitted prior to and at the public hearing, inspected the subject property and heard public testimony presented at the hearing: and

WHEREAS, the Planning Department recommended that the site be designated as Site No. 455, in the Historic Landmarks by the Historical Resources Board; and

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, the Historical Resources Board based its designation of the ARMED SERVICES YMCA on the following finding: Criteria A (community history), C (architecture) and D (master architect). The YMCA was built in 1924 by Master Architect Lincoln Rogers. The architecture is Italian Renaissance style. The activities of the YMCA have evolved through the years as a place for religious gatherings, physical programs and many more, all contributing to the community of downtown San Diego.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, by the Historical Resources Board for the City of San Diego, that in light of the foregoing, it hereby approves the historical site designation of the above named property. The designation includes the site and exterior of the building as Site No. 455.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Secretary to the Historical Resources Board shall cause a certified copy of this resolution to be recorded in the office of the County Recorder at no fee for the benefit of the City, with no documentary tax due.
