**Detectives Seek Assistance to Identify
Suspect in Attempt Bank Robbery;
Very Clear Surveillance Photo's Obtained from Bank**
SUSPECT IN CUSTODY
AS OF 10-30-06

San Diego County Crime Stoppers is joining forces with the San Diego Police Department's robbery unit to help identify and apprehend a suspect responsible for attempt robbery.

Detectives said on September 30, 2006, at approximately 11:30 a.m. a Hispanic male attempted to rob the Washington Mutual Bank at 5111 Mission Center Road. During the course of the robbery, the suspect became nervous and left the bank before receiving any money. Fortunately the bank surveillance camera obtained very clear photos of the suspect.

The suspect is described as a 25-35-year-old Hispanic male. He had black spiky hair, medium build and wore a long sleeve black shirt, blue jean pants and tennis shoes. **Several photos of the suspect are attached to this release.**

Anyone with information on the identity and/or location of these suspects should call the **Crime Stoppers anonymous toll-free tip line at (888) 580-TIPS**. Crime Stoppers is offering up to a \$1,000 reward to anyone with information that leads to the arrest of these suspects.
