



Detectives Looking to Identify Suspects in a Recent Street Robbery; Composite and Photos of Stolen Property Released

San Diego County Crime Stoppers is joining forces with San Diego Police Department Mid-City detectives to help identify and apprehend the suspects responsible for a recent street robbery at the Joan Kroc Center on University Avenue.

On Sunday, November 12, 2006, four teenagers were robbed in the parking lot at the Joan Kroc Center at 6800 University Avenue. Detectives say the teenage victims were approached initially by two African-American females; the suspects hit the victims as they demanded the victim's jackets and other personal belongings. The two males that were with the victims attempted to stop the robbery. As the men came to the victims' aide, six to eight African-American males, who were believed to be with the female suspects, attacked the men. In all, the two female victims and two male victims were robbed. The suspects were last seen heading south on 69th street from the Joan Kroc Center.

Detectives said the victims lost two very distinct high-end jackets (Bape); a picture of the two jackets is attached to this release. A composite of one of the female suspects is also attached to this release.
