SCAM ARTIST WITH \$1 MILLION WARRANT SOUGHT

(San Diego) San Diego Police Department Financial Crimes detectives are asking for assistance from the public in locating a scam artist who has a one million dollar outstanding warrant for grand theft (487 PC).

Detectives say Raymond "RC" Anderson, 49, (photo on page two) portrays himself as a businessman and inventor to get victims to invest in his projects. He then spends the investor money on himself and moves on to a new group of investors. Anderson's scams have spanned four or five years and have cost victims nearly \$700,000.

If you believe you have been a victim of Anderson, Financial Crimes detectives want to speak with you. Names of the false projects he has set up include: Traffic Alert, Select One Technologies, Helmet Alert and Global Technologies. Anderson operates throughout California and in Nevada. Anderson is believed to be in San Diego. He is a black male, 49 years old, 5' 5" 150 lbs.
