San Diego County Crime Stoppers is joining forces with the San Diego Police Department's Robbery Unit to help apprehend the suspect responsible for an armed robbery that occurred on July 14, 2009 in Pacific Beach.

The suspect entered the Better Buzz Coffee shop at 1900 Garnet Avenue at about 10 a.m. He waited for customers to leave, threatened the cashier with a handgun and demanded money. After getting an undisclosed amount of money from the cashier he fled on foot. No vehicle was seen by the witnesses. A photo of the suspect can be found on page two of this news release.

Suspect description:

- White male, mid 20s to mid 30s, 5'6" to 5'9", 150 lbs. with a thin build. He had a moustache and very short, light brown hair. He was wearing a striped shirt and jeans.

Detectives are asking anyone with information on the identity of this suspect to call the **Crime Stoppers anonymous tip line at (888) 580-8477**.
